

Philippians 4:19, "And my God will meet all your needs according to his glorious riches in Jesus Christ."

I don't know if you have ever gone through a time of complete dependence on God for your physical or material needs...but I have had that experience when an unexpected injury occurred in my own life. For others, perhaps you lost a job and didn't have income. You might have gotten sick and were unable to work. Bottom line, there are circumstances in our lives that put us in a place of dependence on God.

When God brought the people of Israel out of Egypt through the desolate desert, they had no ability to provide for themselves. God met their needs by providing manna from heaven each day but the Sabbath. This was a season in their lives to learn not only dependence on God, but just how faithful God was as a provider. Eventually they entered the Promised Land. When they did, God's provision was no longer required. "The manna stopped the day after they ate the food from the land; there was no longer any manna for the Israelites, but that year they ate of the produce of Canaan." (Joshua 5:12). In both cases God was the provider of their needs.

For most of us, we derive our necessities of life through our work. Like the birds of the fields we are commanded to go out and gather what God has already provided. It is a process of participation in what God has already provided. Sometimes it appears that it is all up to us; and sometimes it appears like it is all up to God. In either case we must realize that the Lord is our provider; our work is only an instrument of his provision of gifts and blessings that is given to us. He requires our involvement in either case.

"You may say to yourself, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." But it is good to remember the Lord your God, for it is God who gives you the ability and gifts to produce an income, and confirms his covenant, which he swore to your forefathers, as it is today." (Deuteronomy 8:17-18)

When we come to worship, fellowship, or study God's word, it is a time of gratitude and praise God for all the blessings we are given. Why? Because God provides for our every need if we seek him and God is faithful.

It is time to look for the blessings God has given to us and remember all the times that God has been faithful even in the midst of pain and hardships. Be the change that you want to see in others, for we may be the only bible that anyone ever reads. ~~~Pastor Barb

I have summoned you by name; you are mine.

When you pass through the waters,

I will be with you;

And when you pass through the rivers

they will not sweep over you

When you walk through the fire you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the Lord your God."

(Isaiah 43:1-3)

#### And God expects us to provide comfort to others:

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ." (2 Corinthians 1:3-5)

### **Hygiene Kits**

 $\sqrt{$ One hand towel measuring 15"x28" to 16"x32" (no fingertip, dish towel or micro-fiber)

✓One wash cloth

✓One wide-toothed comb removed from the package (found at discount dealers like Salleybeauty.com)

 $\checkmark$ One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from the package (either one is acceptable)

 $\checkmark$ One bath size bar of soap in the original package

 $\checkmark$ One toothbrush in the original package

√Ten standard size Band-Aids All items need to fit in a onegallon Ziploc type bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing. Search for "wide-tooth combs" to see an example of combs that meet the kit requirements.

### School Kits

 $\checkmark$ One pair blunt scissors removed from package (rounded tip only)

✓Three 70 count notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose-leaf or filler paper

√One 30 centimeter, 12" ruler

 $\mathbf{V}$ One hand-held pencil sharpener removed from package

 $\checkmark$ One large eraser (no pencil cap erasers)

 $\checkmark$ Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers. Please remove pencils from the package.
