# \*THE IMMIGRANTS' HOLIDAY

At its roots, Thanksgiving—the only uniquely American holiday—is a celebration of immigration. When the Plymouth Colony pilgrims invited the Native Americans to join them for the first Thanksgiving feast in 1621 they celebrated not only the successful harvest that would feed them for the next year, but also their gratitude to God for safe passage to a new land. Those who celebrated were the fortunate ones...the few who had survived the journey and the harsh winter.

In 2007 folks from several Presbyterian congregations in Winston-Salem joined forces at El Buen Pastor to serve Thanksgiving dinner to immigrants from Latin America. That first year the families were a bit shy—not quite sure what to expect, but they arrived expectantly at noon sharp, dressed in their best clothes in recognition of the fact that they were the honored guests. Unaccustomed to coming empty-handed to a meal, the women in particular had a hard time being served rather than doing the serving. Indeed, it was a strange twist in this city of many popular Mexican restaurants to see the tables turned, so to speak, as the immigrants were waited on by the native-born.

Three years later we have an established tradition, already familiar and predictable. Thanksgiving at El Buen Pastor begins with a time of prayer, Scripture, and song in the sanctuary, along with a dramatic rendition of that first Plymouth Thanksgiving—in Spanish and English. Then everyone files into the fellowship hall for a turkey dinner. After the pie is served, the men and children head outside, weather permitting, to play *fútbol Americano* while the women divide up the leftovers and the little ones finish constructing their paper hats.

This year we'll be adding something new to the menu, and the *muchachas* won't be coming empty-handed. They'll be bringing jalapeños and salsa to have with the turkey instead of gravy. What a great picture of our evolving American culture—holding on to the best traditions, while always being open to new developments.

# **\*VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT ON THE PARENTS—***LOS PADRES*



After several years of running our after school programs, we realized that unless their parents were involved at El Buen Pastor in some way, the children would not have consistent attendance and would eventually drop out of the program. This fall we introduced a new requirement for parents—two hours of volunteer service a week per family. Although there has been a solid core of adult volunteers who take care of the building

and grounds and prepare food for celebrations, this is the first time we have required that parents participate in children's programming. Parents prepare and serve the after school snack, manage sign-in and sign-out procedures, monitor the playground, assist in the preschool rooms, and direct traffic in the parking lot.

After two months of schedule adjustments, Director of Family Life Programs Enrique Rodriguez-Pastor is pleased with the results, saying, "An unexpected benefit of the family volunteer program is that parents who have been less involved in the past are developing relationships with other parents and adding to the feeling of community."

One of the family volunteers told us "It's the least I can do! I am grateful for all the tutors who come every week to help my children in a way that I am not able to help them." The children love it when their parents are here, and the parents gain new insights into what their children are learning and an added sense of ownership in our programs, as well as the confidence to volunteer at their children's schools.
