Dear Church Family,

Unfortunately, the news from around the country and our city has not been encouraging. The Delta variant of Covid-19 has caused dramatic increases in the transmission of this virus. Pastor Barry asked me to contact the members of our "Back to Church" team and get their opinion on wearing masks and social distancing. One member felt it should be a personal decision while all other members were in favor of wearing masks again.
