# The Cross As the Way

This Lenten season I've spent a good bit of time reflecting on the cross. We've done that in our book study, *Savior: What the Bible Says A bout the Cross.* I'm also reading Fleming Rutledge's great book, *The Crucifixion*, over Lent. I highly recommend her work to you, but especially this book. She discusses meanings of the crucifixion of Jesus that's often neglected in our death/suffering-avoidance world. One quote that I've been reflecting on speaks to what the cross means for us today:

"The resurrection...does not cancel out the contradiction and shame of the cross in this present life; rather, the resurrection ratifies the cross as the way "until he comes."

"The way until he comes." The cross isn't just an act by Jesus for our salvation-It's also a way of life for us in this world until Christ returns. That's why Jesus tells us that in order to be his disciples, we must take up our own crosses. Should it surprise us then that the life of the Christian can often be at odds with the world? Friends, this should never surprise us. The way of the cross is often a contradiction with earthly powers. That's one of the reasons that Jesus was crucified. As Paul told the church in Corinth and now the church in America, "the preaching of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to those who are being saved it is the power of God." 1 Cor. 1:18

"If anyone wants to follow me, you must deny yourselves and take up your cross."

Are you ready to follow Jesus? The cross is the way.
