World Communion Sunday

The First Sunday of October is what we call World Communion Sunday. I can't think of a better time to celebrate it than right now! Our country is deeply divided along racial and political lines, so what better way to speak the truth of Christ than gathering around the Lord's Table on World Communion Sunday. Notice the two words: The first is "World." On World Communion Sunday we remember that the church is global. We are part of a church of all ages, nations, and races. When the world seeks to divide us, we seek to be united through our shared worship of the Triune God. While we are different, we acknowledge that the most importance characteristic of humanity is one that we share in common: We are created in the image of God. What would happen if we saw the image of God in everyone?

The other word is "Communion." We all gather around the table to receive Christ's body and blood. We become one in Christ through receiving this gift of God's grace. We all come to the table, laying aside what sets us apart in the world's eyes with empty hands, realizing how needy we are for God's grace.

As I think toward Sunday, I realize that we haven't received Holy Communion in seven months! That's perhaps what I have missed the most during this crazy year. While we will receive a bit differently this Sunday (We'll stay in our pews and have disposable cups and wafers), I'm trusting that Jesus will be present in a tangible way though his body and blood. I'll see you then!


