MINUTES: Minutes of Stated Meeting of Session on March 12, 2019 were approved. We received two requests to be removed from membership: Charlene and Johnny Crocker.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Jennifer Hege provided the March financial report for review and it was approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Building & Grounds

- Discolored ceiling tiles will be replaced.
- FPC Van Updates: shelter has been stabilized, step entering the double doors of the van has been painted, van now has FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH displayed on the sides.
- LED lighting has been installed above choir loft.
- Sanctuary and hall lighting under review to determine how best to brighten up these areas.
- Planning a Saturday workday to relocate nursery and church library for better security for our children. (Session approved this move so the children's area would not be located in close proximity to the parking lot door.)
- Landscaping updates: Removed bushes at corner of Colonial & Randolph, will landscape the area. Possibly transplant old brick sign in front yard of church to corner location with help of Thomasville High School carpentry/masonry class students.
- Thomasville High School instructor has been invited to look at exterior double doors at the front of old church building (which enters into the hallway outside kitchen) to determine if his students can do necessary repairs/replacement.

Christian Education

- April is Child Abuse Awareness month; we will place pinwheels up the front sidewalk to the church to commemorate this.
- We have scheduled an Easter Egg Hunt for Easter Sunday morning and an Easter Play.

Congregational Care

• CPR Class was really great (4 hours). Plan to do an AED class soon, maybe after Worship Services one Sunday. CPR and First Aid class will be a requirement of the Nursery Attendants. FPC will pay the for Certificate and training for the attendants.

Outreach

- Fish Fry—Spring Fling Extravaganza will be held on June 1 from 10:00 am-2:00 pm. All funds to go to community missions.
- Spring Daze support needed.
- Remaining *Nickels for Hunger* dates are 5/19, 8/11, 10/27.
