From Our Shared Heart...

It feels strange to start another round of our church year's liturgical holy days and still be in the global

pandemic. It was Holy Week Second Time Suspended Worship, Easter Second Time, etc. Hopefully by Pentecost Sunday, God willing, we will be able to have some inperson worship happening again. IF it seems safe enough. Always, "Do No Harm" is our guiding principle in this pandemic.

Our "Reimagining Our Lives Together" team is working on logistics and plans for how we will begin to emerge from the isolation and shut-down of the pandemic as the vaccination roll-out continues. We have a lot to consider for the safety of all, to the best we can ensure that, and we have to get our plans approved by our District Superintendent.

One question I pray about and ponder in my own heart is: after the entombment of sorts that we have experienced this past year, how much Resurrection are we willing to receive? Jesus did not resurrect himself. It was an act of God. We too are called, as cells in the Body of Christ, to live a Resurrection Life. Jesus came out of that tomb, resurrected, and alive at a whole new level of BEing. Truly, he was the Lord of the Dance!

My prayer is that we too will emerge from this part of the "long, dark night of the soul" that our planet has been experiencing as transformed, as filled with God, as Jesus was. Even being just a tiny bit so would rock our world!

Pray with me this month for wisdom in discernment as we wait for God's resurrecting power in our lives as a church. Watch for signs of Resurrection Life. Pray for us to be able to BE the Christ in this community and in our world.

In a year like we've had in 2020-2021, the tombs of death, economic loss, grief and unrest are obvious. Yet some tombs we need to emerge from are of our own making and we ask ourselves, "what holds us back from claiming our freedom to really LIVE and to dance our dances fully?" No matter what confines us, the Easter message is one that offers the courage for new starts.

Some of you may be familiar with the country western song from over a decade ago, "I Hope You Dance" by Lee Ann Womack. It is a wonderful commissioning/ blessing song... "If you get the chance to sit it out or to dance, I hope you'll dance." Can you just imagine Jesus saying these words to the still-confused-and-scared disciples during one of his post-resurrection appearances?! Even though Easter comes and we are called to live as "Easter people" with no fear of death, this is not always an easy thing for us to do, especially in times of great anxiety. But sometimes we have to just let the dance take us... to allow God's joy to invade our reality. This is why, as we move toward Pentecost in late May. I pray we can allow this season be one in which we "Dare to Dance Again." Dare to dance, even in the midst of fear and suffering. Dare to dance an Easter dance of the promise of resurrection. "Dare to Dance Again" will be the theme and focus of our worship services between Easter and Pentecost.

More than ever . . . now, more than ever . . . what the world needs now is for us to dance alive love, sweet love!



May each of you be blessed with Resurrection Life through the love of God and the indwelling Holy Spirit so that we can be the Body of Christ, dancing with the Lord of the Dance, for a suffering world!

The guest speaker was Justin Carpenter. She was the youngest of nine children in her family. She works with undocumented and DACA students at the University of Oregon. DACA stands for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals. One in twelve have an undocumented parent which means that the parent can be deported. DACA students are not eligible for benefits, thus donations support DACA scholarships for the students. We were encouraged to support a Dreamer Scholarship Fund. During the first 6 sessions we covered prior to Lent, we looked at what we were able to learn of Paul's early life and experiences that led him to make a radical shift in his view of the new Jewish sect which came to be called Christians as he moved from being a fierce persecutor of them to a vocal teacher within the movement. We left off our study as he was just beginning his years of missionary traveling, teaching and writing.

The City of Florence will be doing a pilot program on home composting. They will be providing households with one of three different home composters and in return asking for feedback on how well they work and composting methods that seem to work well in our area.

The Green Mountain Landfill (Lane County's landfill) produces a lot of methane, a powerful greenhouse gas. There is a big push to get organics, in other words yard waste and food waste, out of the landfill. One of the ways to accomplish this is with home composting.

If this pilot program is successful, the City may expand the program. The final details have not been worked out, but it is hoped the project can be launched by Earth Day. Stay tuned!
