But I alone am not doing this! Many of you have been slowly cleaning up different aspects of our facilities: the sound booth, the library, our sanctuary, and the parson-




age (which I will be moving into in August). I don't enjoy letting go of my belongings. I enjoy the memories that are sparked by various possessions and relish the opportunity to remember.


