Patty Evans told me a story about a rural church and of the people, so small, that its sanctuary's sole purpose was a gathering space for worship. As a result, the building had what you'd expect: a simple table and lectern, well-worn pews, and hymnals. Things like electricity were of less importance, if you can believe it! Instead, the people brought their own light. Each Sunday, the people would bring their candles and set them in the sconces. The light on any given Sunday was dependent on whether or not the people came, light in tow. If people were plenty, so was the light. If the people were few, the light shone, though dimly.

I love this imagery for the church. Separately, we each shine our light outside our walls, but it is of importance that we gather together on Sundays so that we might be a bright beacon for Florence—and for the world! The light of Christ shines through our lives and our collective ministry here. The light of Christ will be our theme and our anchor this advent season. Whenever you turn on your lights or light your candles to warm your home, think on the marvelous mystery of Christ coming to us—as light, as a vulnerable baby, as our peace and our hope. May God illumine your night in these days.

# PFLAG to Hold Holiday White Elephant Party

PFLAG kicks off Christmas with its annual "White Elephant" gift exchange on Monday, December 11, at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. This reflects a change in regular meeting dates to the second Monday (rather than Tuesday) of the month.

A "White Elephant" exchange is a way to give and get a gift by drawing a number and selecting a wrapped present on a table or "taking" a gift from someone who's already made a selection. We limit our "gifts" to an item under \$5, or something fun you find around the house and want to "unload." Just wrap it up, bring it in, and take your turn choosing a wrapped item brought by someone else – or taking a gift won by and already unwrapped by another. Bring a friend. Our meetings are always free and there are always refreshments. If you don't have a gift, don't let that stop you from coming. We always have "extras."

Our membership year began in October. Dues are \$30 per year. Membership is not required to be active in the group. It's simply PFLAG's way of continuing to provide support and education in the community. We are not a lobbying group, but a 501(c)3 charitable organization. On Saturday, November 18, 2023, Cindy Wobbe's Annual Food Share "Pounding" at Grocery Outlet, netted **17,803 lbs** of food! Our local Food Share supports 800 families throughout the area. Our church has a Food Share barrel in the foyer where members can place food, and other items for those in need. Patt Rollins says that when our barrel is full it warrants 70 to 80 pounds of food! Jim dropped me off at Grocery Outlet and I was able to contribute 79 pounds on the 18<sup>th</sup> to Food Share. He was telling me to hurry up in my boot, because he had to get to choir practice...Geez!

The Nurture Committee has a tradition of sponsoring a **Reverse Advent Calendar**. Advent starts after Thanksgiving and most Advent calendars are made to open a window and receive something; however, with our **Reverse Advent Calendar**, an item of food or a necessity is placed into a box each day of Advent for Food Share. At the end of Advent, we will have a wonderful selection of boxes filled with not only food, but love for Food Share. Feel free to decorate your boxes if you so desire. I know we've had fun doing our boxes the last few years. Last year, I added gloves and some small toys as well.

Here is a list of items especially needed for Food Share: peanut butter, canned meat (tuna, chili), canned fruit, Ramen, canned vegetables, sugar, potatoes, oatmeal, mac-n-cheese, flour, canned soup, coffee, milk, eggs, dog food, cheese, and diapers. Additionally, items for Holiday meals would be appreciated.



# **Sweet Potato Casserole**Submitted by Rosie Goodwin

#### Ingredients:

- 3 cups mashed sweet potatoes (or 2 30 oz. cans); drain well
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 1/3 cup milk

Mix the above well with electric mixer or mash well. Put into a 9 x 13 pan. Then mix together the following:

- 1/3 cup butter (softened)
- 1/2 cup flour
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup chopped nuts

Mix well, then spread on top of potato mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 - 45 minutes.
