Happy, safe and healthy holy-days, Beloved Community!

It's early evening on Thanksgiving Day as I write this. Alan and I just finished a virtual family gathering with my daughter Kara and her family in Eugene and my son Rick and his sons in Seattle. Like millions of others, we had to change our plans and give up our preferences for the holiday due to tightened restrictions and more stringent travel advisories in both OR and WA. As I look ahead to Advent and Christmas, I realize the same kind of "unprecedented" times are ahead, most likely, for all of us.

One of my biggest gratitudes is for our church and how we have done the best we could in these times. We continue to gather, although virtually instead of in-person, we continue to make a difference in the lives of others, and we continue to function amazingly well under these trying circumstances. Your commitment and love for our church have kept us afloat financially and in every other way.

Another of my gratitudes this season is for the generous donation you made to the Heifer Project recently in my honor for Pastor Appreciation Week. Yesterday, the Hand family and I met by Zoom and picked out \$600 worth of animals: we

are helping 12 families internationally through donating 2 flocks of chicks; 2 flocks of ducks: 3 hives of bees for 3 villages; a goat; a sheep; and an alpaca. Best of all, during this season, there are donors who match whatever is donated by others. So we were able to double the \$600 and make a \$1200 difference in the lives of so many families. Every year, I donate in honor of my grandchildren and to have received such a generous donation in my honor from you was truly a heartwarming blessing!

Advent Is Upon Us; Try Something New!

Although we have been looking toward producing an Advent Devotional booklet, that did not seem to be of major interest to many of you. Sincere thanks to all who sent in material, and perhaps we will be able to use it at another time. Nevertheless, the Nurture committee has decided to suggest something new!

Frequently an Advent Calendar is used by families and children in the season leading to Christmas each year. Each day, a window/door/package/box is opened and inside is a small gift for the person opening it. It is a wonderful way to help children and the young-(impatient?)-at-heart to count the days until Christmas.

Our suggestion is for you to reverse this process, and with each day "open a new door" and put *in* something, instead of taking out something. Begin with an empty box, and on each day add some non-perishable food item (can of vegetables or fruit, box of macaroni and cheese, etc.), so by the end of Advent you will have a box filled with food to be donated to Food Share. Many will then benefit from your reverse Advent Calendar! Wouldn't it be wonderful if each family could "gift" a box of food to Food Share in the couple of days before Christmas?



Free Lunch has now served 1,675 Subway voucher meals and is currently distributing an average of 20 meals per lunch.





After receiving a grant from *Fill Your Pantry*, we have purchased \$250 of emergency food for our pantry. I have cleared out surplus kitchen equipment from the pantry to the Sunday school room (4 electric roasters; 4 of 5 extra crockpots; and miscellaneous coffee and restaurant equipment) to make room. If you'd like to claim any of these items, contact Paula Z at 541-603-6948. Otherwise, I intend to donate them to the Humane Society and St. Vinny's.

Since Thanksgiving fell on a Thursday and Subway was to be closed, we made sure all our customers knew about the Free Turkey Community Dinner provided by Kiwanis at the Elk's. We learned that all of the food was going to be served to-go and <u>cold!</u> Linda of Linda's Thrift loaned us a microwave, a Kiwanis dad brought a generator and two Elks warmed up the food for the un-kitchened walkers or those on bikes for around 20 of "our people". They served a total of 467 full Thanksgiving meals in 35 minutes!

Florence Plastics Hit the Road

EcoGeneration, Lane County, Master Recyclers and generous businesses and local individuals partnered to provide plastics recycling in Florence Sunday November 1st. Since most plastics stopped being collected curbside in 2018, Lane County has promoted opportunities for plastics collection throughout the county. The latest event is that hosted by Ecogeneration. These recycling events keep material from being sent to the Short Mountain landfill, saving county residents and businesses money by extending the life of the landfill. They also make these plastics available for recycling into other plastic products saving the expense of producing raw materials to manufacture new goods. Below are the highlights of the event:

- --640 lbs of # 2-4-5 plastics were screened and collected
- --an additional 250-500 lbs of assorted materials across a dozen categories collected for reuse and recycling collected
- --200 families served
- --3 county staff, county truck
- --2 EcoGeneration volunteers
- -- 1 Cottage Grove Master Recycler
- -- 9 Florence Master Recyclers
- -- 4 Florence community volunteers
- --Truck loan from Brad's in Cottage Grove
- --financial support from generous individuals in Florence

Because Florence Master Recyclers promoted event sponsorships and these three organizations stepped up (Florence United Methodist Church, Central Coast Disposal and County Transfer & Recycling) EcoGeneration was able to commit to three Recycling Take Back events in Florence for 2021. Florence Master Recyclers Britte Kirsch and Nancy Rhodes helped produce the November 1 Recycling Take Back event. More support from the Florence community will be needed to ensure the success of upcoming collections.
