From Our Shared Heart...

Beloved Church,



I can practically feel it in the air! People everywhere are so ready for 2020 to be gone! What a year like none other in our lives, no matter who we are, where we live, what our life circumstances are . . . we are living in anticipation of coming out of lock-down and putting the pandemic behind us. We have all been affected, one way or another, and usually in many ways.

What comes to my mind as I hear pundits and thought-leaders, comedians and prognosticators, and extremists of both a pessimistic bent and an optimistic persuasion ... is whoa, fasten your seatbelts even tighter in 2021! It absolutely won't be simply a matter of just "going back to normal" or the "way things were." There are many causes for concern, even grounds for alarm. But one thing we know for sure in the midst of this "global dark night of the soul" as some have termed it or our "dark night of the species," as theologian and evolutionary theologian Matthew Fox calls it ... we are never going to be the same.

Life always shapes, tweaks, twists and hammers us . . . and if we don't listen up to the message of the Universe, of Life itself (aka the Divine), then the message gets louder for our benefit when we are shaking our heads and stopping our ears, or even when we have just gotten a little hard of hearing . . . maybe due to listening to too much rock music at too many decibels back in the day . . . or the hardening of our attitudes through resistance to rapid change . . . or the feeling we can hardly or cannot at all keep up as we age and the world is like a herd of lemmings at times or in ways rushing toward the edge of the cliff. Words like geocide, ecocide, and matricide (killing Mother Earth) are thrown around in the consciousness-space we share through the news media, social media, and publication of dire scientific warnings.

What do we make of all this as a people of faith, as Beloved Community?

Join us for "How Not to Waste a Pandemic" during our four Sunday sermon series in January 2021 after the first Sunday on January 3, which is Epiphany of the Lord Sunday and a celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Communion to get the year off to a good start, on the right foot at least, spiritually speaking.

What have been the unexpected lessons, gifts, and serendipities of 2020 for you and yours? How have you been changed? How have you grown? What have been the losses? Where is the redemption of suffering that we so believe in and cherish as our bedrock foundation of life as "Easter people," living not from the Crucifixion, but from the Resurrection?

I would love to have your input and your shared witness during these 4 worship services as we look at the pandemic from a Christian perspective, and particularly through a Wesleyan Methodist lens. Please let me know if you have a testimony or witness, a reflection, a nugget of wisdom, a story to share. This is OUR story, our shared journey.

Adult Sunday School to Study Paul



Our Adult Zoom "Sunday School" on Fridays, (2:00 -

3:00 pm) will begin a biography of the apostle Paul on Friday, January 8. Professor N. T. Wright will use Paul's letters and Acts to give new life to the person of Paul, who many feel is the person most responsible for the multitudes of faithful followers of Jesus Christ today.

We will be covering the first 6 sessions before taking a break during Lent, and then finish this series after Easter. Each session consists of 2 videos: a short (less than a minute) reading of the scripture on which that lecture is based and then a lecture, less than 20 minutes long. You can watch these for each session when you choose the week prior to our gathering, and they will be the basis for the class discussion on Zoom.
