A Word From Your Lay Leader...

When I started this article, my thoughts were upbeat. I was anxious to share summer fun, summer camp at Magruder, vacation to see family, and all of the summer activities we have missed during two years of a crazy pandemic.

Instead, my phone buzzed with a news alert....14 children and 1 teacher killed at Robb Elementary school in a small community of Uvalde, Texas. Unimaginable, simply unimaginable. 14 innocent children. Children, just children, with a lifetime ahead of them. And a teacher who was doing what teachers do, protect their students.

This morning when parents dropped their kids off at school, they had every expectation that they were going to be able to pick their child up when the school day ended. I am heartbroken. Tears flow freely. Just little kids. God help us. For me to process such a horrific shooting involving children, I can only envision Jesus, with His arms extended, welcoming 14 little ones and their teacher to reside with him in a place of eternal peace. That thought keeps me sane.

Let us never, ever assume that this horrific event couldn't happen in Florence or in any of our schools or churches...it could. God forbid we should ever see a school shooting in our town. Hug your kids, hug your family members, and tell those you love, that you love them.

Pray for the families. Pray for the school. Pray for those recovering in local hospitals. Pray for our nation. Pray for our world.

No words...just tears.





Florence UMC's account with the Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative (OBRC) "Bottle Drop" program allows everyone who has one of our tagged bags to contribute the value of their returnable bottles and cans to the church.

Kids going to Methodist camp, their friends, relatives, and everyone in the congregation, can pitch in and fill bags to benefit the program. We hope Bottle Drop is a win-win for our campers.

Pick up a blue bag, sticker, and card at the back of church.

- Attach the sticker on the bag
- Bring the bag to a Bottle Drop station at the north side of Fred Meyer
- Use the paper card to unlock the door at the Bottle Drop
- Scan the card as indicated, open the door and place your tagged bag on the chute inside
- Bottle Drop does the rest counts the contents of the bag and credits our account

Honey Poppy Seed Fruit Salad

Ingredients

- 2 medium firm bananas, chopped
- 2 cups fresh blueberries
- 2 cups fresh raspberries
- 2 cups fresh sliced strawberries
- 5 tablespoons honey
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- 3/4 tsp poppy seeds

Directions

In a large bowl, combine the bananas and berries. In a small bowl, combine the honey, lemon juice, and poppy seeds. Pour over fruit and toss to coat.
