From Our Shared Heart...

Beloved Church,

It's somewhat overwhelming to me to

realize that it has been almost a full year since we last met for in-person worship and our Bishop had to close our churches due to COVID-19. Many are feeling "pandemic fatigue," even as we are cautiously optimistic that there is an end in sight to the pandemic as the vaccine roll-out continues.

There have been many aspects to grieve and mourn from this experience of a global pandemic, not the least of which is the loss of over 500,000 people at this point in the US. We have been fortunate and blessed indeed that we have not to this point lost anyone in our church from the virus. While it has been extremely challenging to forgo being together in-person, the end result that we wanted was the health and well-being of our congregation, with the suspension of in-person worship and closure of our buildings as the means to support that goal.

Certainly a toll has still been taken in terms of isolation, loneliness, and not being able to gather together for support, connection, and community. For those of you without internet access, this is particularly true, as well as for those of you who although you have internet connectivity, are not comfortable with technologies and platforms such as Zoom.

Two things happened today. First, we received word from the Greater NW Area of our denomination that we are still under the guidelines of the Reimagining Our Lives Together document that our Bishop issued to us many months ago. While we are optimistic about the vaccine roll-out, we are still living in much uncertainty and will continue to do so for some months ahead. We don't have enough information yet to know just how safe it would be to move

toward in-person worship. What about the variants of the virus? What about the asymptomatic vaccinated persons who might possibly spread the virus unknowingly? To what extent are the vaccines working?

Secondly, we had a Zoom meeting of our own Reimagining Our Lives Together (RLT) team (Patt Rollins, Scott Philben, Terry Woodward, Linda Yoder, and Peggy Hughes, with Amanda Sarles and Jim Waterman unable to attend today). The consensus was that we are not ready to seriously and immediately work on a plan for re-entering in-person worship and opening our buildings back up. We too felt there is still too much unknown about how things will unfold with this pandemic. The team is, however, very committed to doing our best to make our decisions based on the best information we have. We want to do the right things for our congregation for the right reasons. We also recognize that the more time that passes with this pandemic, there is a negative impact of varying severity on our members who might be feeling isolated, depressed, and anxious. Our feeling is that 45-60 days from now, we will know a lot more about how safe it is to get back together in person for worship and small groups like the Covenant Group as well as the UMW and our Free Lunch outreach. So we hope to be able to submit a plan to our District Superintendent for re-opening as we are required to do by the Bishop's RLT process.

As your pastor, I am doing everything I can to continue our life together as a church, espe-



cially with worship. I am deeply appreciative of the hard work, dedication and commitment from our staff, Linda Yoder and Sharon Belvill. There is so much to be grateful for in how we've been able to pull together and stay afloat. Thank you for all your prayers and efforts, your financial support and your encouragement. Don't stop now! This has become a marathon or maybe a triathlon, not a sprint or a stroll on the beach!

One last thing, Peggy Hughes, a member of the RLT team and a retired nurse, has taken on providing assistance to any of you who need help with using your internet or your phone to get pre-registered for scheduling your vaccines. Please feel free to reach out to her at auntpeg0929@gmail.com, or call her at (541) 902-0197. She's happy to help.

Stay safe. Trust the process. Know that your leadership is working on this and is committed to getting us all back together as soon as it's safe to do so. Keep the faith and keep on keepin' on!

St. Patrick's Day

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at the age of 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people.

In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Perhaps the most well-known legend of St. Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock.

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated annually on March 17, the anniversary of his death in the fifth century. The Irish have observed this day as a religious holiday for over 1,000 years. On St. Patrick's Day, which falls during the Christian season of Lent, Irish families would traditionally attend church in the morning and celebrate in the afternoon. Lenten prohibitions against the consumption of meat were waived and people would dance, drink and feast-on the traditional meal of Irish bacon and cabbage.
