November is a time we gather for thanksgiving meals and many of us use this month to practice gratitudes.

Coincidentally, it is Native American Heritage Month. Native peoples have much to teach us in the way of gratitude and seeing gifts in creation. A favorite book



of mine is called *Braiding Sweetgrass*, by Robin Wall Kimmerer, a botanist and a Potawatomi woman. She weaves together indigenous wisdom and science together in her book. One story I will never forget involves her study of sweetgrass growth. Does sweetgrass flourish when it is harvested consistently, or if a meadow is left alone to grow wildly? Surprisingly, the patches of sweetgrass that were harvested from regularly were the ones that produced more.

Perhaps gifts from God are a bit that way—we need to take it as much as we give it. Miraculously, the gift will not shrink but expand. No gift of God is wasted, nor does it need to be hoarded in order to survive. What gifts from God are you harvesting? What fields of new growth are you seeing?

Recipe Corner

Lemon Mousse Portuguese Dessert

When Jim and I were in Portugal three years ago, we ate at a delightful hole in the wall fish house in Praia do Norte, Nazare. Nazare is a beautiful coastal town famous for surfing. Along with our fish we had this delightful dessert. I tried to get the recipe but to no avail, so I improvised Enjoy!

Ingredients:

Juice of 5 medium Lemons, at least ½ cup of fresh Lemon Juice

- 1 Tablespoon of Lemon Zest
- 1 Pint Heavy Whipping Cream
- 1 Tablespoon of Powdered Sugar

14 ounces of Sweetened Condensed Milk

Directions:

- Whip the heavy cream and powdered sugar until firm. Fold in the condensed milk, juice, and lemon zest
- Spoon into 10 ½ cup mason jars or other dessert dishes
- I like the mason jars because you can top with a lid and screw top and then they are easy to store in your fridge for company
- To serve: give each person a small jar with a touch of whip cream and a slice of strawberry or a maraschino cherry
