CAROL'S COMMENTS

I've been thinking...about God's long-term preferred future for Florence United Methodist Church and the results from our time together on Homecoming afternoon. In preparation for pondering God's call to us now and in the future, I believe we need to understand the Mission of the Church, our rationale as United Methodists for that Mission, and our process for carrying out that Mission:

- + The mission of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world:
- +...by proclaiming the good news of God's grace and by exemplifying Jesus' command to love God and love neighbor, thus seeking the fulfillment of God's reign and realm in the world. The fulfillment of God's reign and realm in the world is the vision Scripture holds before us...Jesus' words in Matthew provide the Church with our mission: "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything that I've commanded you", and "You

must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind... You must love your neighbor as your-self"... This mission is our grace-filled response to the Reign of God in the world announced by Jesus. God's grace is active everywhere, at all times, carrying out the purpose as revealed in the Bible:

+We make disciples as we:

- proclaim the gospel, seek, welcome, and gather persons into the body of Christ;
- lead persons to commit their lives to God through baptism...
- nurture persons through Christian living...
- send persons into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ by healing the sick; feeding the hungry; caring for the stranger; freeing the oppressed; being and becoming a compassionate, caring presence; and working to develop social structures that are consistent with the gospel; and
- continue the mission of seeking, welcoming, and gathering persons into the community of the body of Christ. (from Paragraphs 120,121 & 122 of the 2016 Book of Discipline of the united Methodist Church)

<u>For our on-going pondering and discernment,</u> I offer these 3 questions:

- 1. Given our Mission as a denomination, are we called by God to be the United Methodist presence in Florence, and beyond, now and in the future? Why or why not?
- 2. What are the needs and hurts of our community?
- 3. As you consider all that is expressed in our Mission as United Methodists and the needs and hurts of the local community, what are we called by God to address?

<u>Summarizing the responses</u> to the questions by those gathered on Homecoming afternoon:

1. UM presence: "Yes", but what might it look like in the future, with who might we be in partnership?

2. Needs/hurts of community:

hunger homelessness depression bullying child care transportation services for: seniors mental health youth children

parenting support
jobs that pay a living wage year around
housing that is affordable and safe
abuse cycles in families
cycles of poverty
LCC lacks AA program on campus

3. Called by God to address:

The needs of younger families
The hungry
Emergency cold weather shelter
The church is about people, the building
needs to enable ministry
The need to Be informed, Be involved. Be
a voice

Ouestions which emerged included:

What is Florence going to look like in the future? What is already going on?

If we had more money, how would we spend it? If we got more money, what would be the source? How might we partner with others? With who might we share space, mission, vision, etc.?

My assignment to everyone is to pray: for discernment, for vision.

If you were unable to participate in the conversations during Homecoming, or if you did and have more to offer, elsewhere in the newsletter the questions are listed; answer them and mail the sheet to the church. Or put your responses in an email.

As we celebrated the first 35 years of Florence United Methodist Church at Homecoming with stories and memories of the past and received five new members, may we indeed move into God's long-term preferred hope for our future! God's Spirit moves among all of us, offering wisdom, counsel and guidance. God's grace is active everywhere, at all times, carrying out the purpose as revealed in the Bible.


Sign up for another year of membership, invite friends, have some great "goodies," share your story, and take a look at our collection of free literature and lending library of books and DVDs.
