From Our Shared Heart...



We have a wonderful opportunity for collaboration coming up in October. Our Church Council voted at the September meeting to participate with St. Paul's UMC in Milwaukie, OR and The Dalles UMC in The Dalles, OR in a study led by Rev. Beth Estock, based on her book, *Discernment: Spiritual Practices for Building a Life of Faith.*

Rev. Beth is a certified Integral Master Coach who coaches faith leaders and churches in North America and the United Kingdom who long to start new faith communities or revitalize existing churches. Reclaiming the ancient practice of discernment is important as we live in post-christendom contexts and can't rely on past ways of being. This is vitally needed today as we find ourselves in a time of rapid change with a sense of unpredictability and disruption. Discernment is a practice of listening for the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Rev. Beth believes that when we build our capacity to align our head, heart, and bodies to listen for that still small voice that guides us in "right action," we will be able to gracefully lead into the future. This course will offer you theory as well as hands-on practices to help you build capacities to listen to your own wisdom and that of our community of faith.

Rev. Beth will preach by prerecorded video for the online services of all three of our congregations on Sunday October

4; I will preach for us all on October 11; Rev. Gigi Siekkenen (The Dalles UMC) will preach October 18; and Rev. Marshall Wattman-Turner (St. Paul's UMC, Milwaukie, OR) will preach October 26.

Rev. Beth will facilitate online Zoom sessions for our churches on Monday nights from 6:00-7:15 p.m. in October. I strongly encourage you to participate in this timely opportunity to deepen your spiritual resilience and gather strength for our collective journey through our momentous 2020 election season, fraught as it will be with "unprecedented" challenges. ("Unprecedented" has to be the word of the year for 2020, right?!) Also, when we emerge from 2020, we will be "reimagining our lives together," as our Bishop Elaine Stanovsky has called us to do. The state of "normal" is like a faraway memory at this point and it appears there will be no simple "going back." Strengthening our spiritual muscles of discernment, of aligning with God's purposes and will, deepening our capacity to practice the ancient spiritual discipline "guard of the heart" of the desert abbas and ammas in the Christian tradition is going to be more necessary than ever.

Please let me know if you'd like to participate in this collaboration, especially the Monday night sessions. I have ordered Rev. Beth's book from Cokesbury, so let Linda Yoder or me know if you'd like a copy.

I will be taking two weeks study leave from September 30 – October 14, although I am not "leaving" to go anywhere. I will be completing some online courses on preaching as well as a mandatory sexual boundaries and ethics training for clergy.

Looking forward to growing in our spiritual practices together!

Are you thinking Advent yet?

Although we still have a month or two before we enter into the season of Advent, I hope you are taking some of your stay-at-home quiet time waiting and praying for the clearing of the COVID – 19 pandemic to reflect and write a meditation to use during that coming Advent season.

Your Nurture committee would like to produce our own Advent meditation booklet this year. The goal is to have this book compiled and ready for your use by the Sunday after Thanksgiving, so you may use it for Advent devotions you use this year. To be able to do this, we would like as many of you as would like to, to produce an Advent Meditation for one or more days of Advent. It may be a prayer, a poem, a drawing, your thoughts on an Advent Scripture passage, or some other meditation you produce.

The format may be quite simple. Refer to a scripture you find applicable to Advent (the Advent Gospel lessons for this year are from the beginning of Mark (13:24–27; 1:1-8), Luke (1:26-38), and John's (1:6-8; 19-28) Gospels), write some thoughts that come to mind as you read it, and end with a short prayer. You might also use a poem, story or drawing, either original or with attribution from another source, which you find special for the Advent season. Remember the theme of preparing for Christ's coming to us and to our world.

These can be emailed [insert church address] or "snail mailed" to the church sometime by the end of October. This will give us time to produce the booklet for us all to use, and give you plenty of time to find inspiration! Recipe Corner Pumpkin Bars

Ingredients:

- 4 large eggs, room temperature
- 1-2/3 cups sugar
- 1 cup canola oil
- 1 can (15 ounces) solid-pack pumpkin
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt

Icing: 6 ounces cream cheese, softened 2 cups confectioners' sugar 1/4 cup butter, softened 1 tsp vanilla extract 1 to 2 tablespoons whole milk

Directions:

In a bowl, beat the eggs, sugar, oil and pumpkin until well blended. Combine the flour, cinnamon, baking powder, baking soda and salt; gradually add to pumpkin mixture and mix well. Pour into an ungreased 15x10x1-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes or until set. Cool completely. For icing, beat the cream cheese, confectioners' sugar, butter and vanilla in a small bowl. Add enough milk to achieve spreading consistency. Spread over bars. Store in the refrigerator.
