The practice began at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA in 1933. The Rev. Hugh Thompson Kerr and his congregation sought to demonstrate the interconnectedness of Christian churches, regardless of denomination. What better place than at the table?








Bottle Drop for Campers

had them clean and sorted. Many expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to prevent these items from going to landfill.

I wish to thank the church for their willingness to reimburse us for the costs incurred to take the plastics to Eugene but I'm happy to advise that we collected community contributions at the event that were sufficient to cover our expenses.

While we hope to encourage people to reduce plastic consumption, Master Recyclers are pleased to announce that we have permission to partner with the City of Florence to offer the Take Back collections on two occasions in 2024. Arbor Day in April, and the Black & White Event in August. I'll let you know the dates when they're confirmed.

Recipe Corner

Butternut Squash Soup with Crisp Pancetta

(makes 12 servings)

Ingredients:

- 4 medium butternut squash (6 pounds)
- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, cut into 8 pieces
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 12 very thin slices of pancetta (3 ounces)
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
- 1 large Spanish onion, chopped
- 6 thyme sprigs, divided
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 quarts chicken stock or low-sodium broth
- 2 tablespoons heavy cream
- Sugar (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F. Halve the squash lengthwise and scoop out the seeds. Set the squash on a rimmed baking sheet, cut sides up. Put a piece of butter in each cavity and season generously with salt and pepper. Drape the squash halves with the pancetta slices. Roast the squash for 45 to 50 minutes, or until tender.
- 2. Transfer the pancetta to paper towels to drain. Crumble and set aside. Scoop the squash out of the skins into a bowl.
- 3. In a large, heavy stockpot, heat the 2 tablespoons of olive oil until shimmering. Add the onion, season with salt and pepper, and cook over moderately high heat, stirring, until softened but not browned, about 6 minutes. Add 3 of the thyme sprigs and the bay leaf. Stir in the squash and the stock and bring to a boil over high heat, stirring frequently. Reduce the heat and simmer the soup for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 4. Pick out and discard the thyme sprigs and bay leaf. Working in batches, transfer the soup to a blender or food processor and puree until thick and creamy-smooth, about 1 minute per batch. Transfer the soup to a clean saucepan. Stir in the heavy cream and season with salt and pepper (and sugar if desired).
- 5. Reheat the soup if necessary. Ladle into 12 bowls. Garnish the soup with the pancetta, the leaves from the remaining 3 thyme sprigs, and a drizzle of olive oil.
