New 'Church Gifts' Policy

Gifts are a good thing, right? Well...most of the time. Sometimes they can be more of a curse than a blessing. Some churches have found themselves with kitchen items that no longer work, broken household candles, and even half open containers of food. Others have been mired in gifts with complicated conditions such as property that can't be sold or utilized due to environmental hazards. As a result, most denominations have developed a Gifts Policy. Essentially, such policies cover what types of gifts the church is willing to receive and what will be refused. They also address how to retire, or re-home items when they are no longer useful.

The Church Council researched Methodist policies, and those of other churches, seeking to develop a policy that would fit our little church. With the intention to encourage the continued donation of useful items and to serve the long-term interest of the congregation, the council adapted and approved a Gift Policy at our last meeting.
