For heaven's sake isn't there just a plain, straight handled, ordinary, bristled brush made anymore? After an exorbitant amount of time researching the brush display I shut my eyes and made my selection and moved on to the toothpaste. "Oh please!"

That's what I said aloud and the man in the aisle with me responded, "Excuse me?" "There are just too many choices these days!" I explained. "It's not good enough to have a toothpaste that gets your teeth clean anymore. We have to have a pharmacy inside the tube. We've got to have our tartar control, fluoride goop, plaque fighter, clean breathalyzers mixed in a tasty, multicolored glop that will attract good looking men and women to come and stare at our dazzling, forest scented mouths!" The man left. I can't blame him but I was trapped in the oral hygiene aisle with no help. Remember the good old days when we didn't even brush our teeth unless someone hog tied us and threatened us with the loss of Christmas?

It is easy to feel trapped, confused, manipulated and powerless in these crazy days. 

On Father's Day, 2024, Jim and I were on our deck, and I had a nice Father's Day meal planned for him. As I tried to get up, it was like a huge weight was pushing me down and I sort of stumbled my way into the living room and sat hard onto the couch. Jim came in and said, "What's wrong?" I said, "I have a terrible headache!" Jim asked if I could get to the car but I couldn't. He called 911. I don't remember anything else from the next few days. Evidently, I was taken to Florence Hospital and it was determined I had suffered a Hemornagic stroke which causes bleeding in the brain. There was a surgeon in Eugene who could put a drain in my brain, so I was airlifted to Eugene. The surgeon saved my life! I spent the next two weeks in Riverbend, in ICU. Needless to say, I don't remember much about those two weeks. My road to recovery has been a remarkable one and I thank Jim, my husband of 50 years, for the day to day support of medications, taking me to appointments, meals, and tender loving care. Our son Bryan, his wife Miley, and son Rex came and gave Jim and I much needed love and support during this dark time. Special thanks for all the prayers, cards, visits, and flowers from our wonderful church family!

I'm quite thankful to Nancy Rhodes and Vicki Philben, two amazing women in our church, who stepped up to work on the Teacher and Staff Gift Bags, not knowing what they were getting themselves into! They solicited new businesses who weren't already community partners, contacted businesses who were already on board to make sure they were again part of the project, bought product, and stored product in their homes! Zucchini Soup

From the Free Lunch Soup Recipes Booklet Submitted by Rosie Goodwin



Ingredients:

4 cups sliced zucchini 1 (10 oz.) can cream of chicken soup

1 medium onion, chopped 1 cup milk

3 tbsp butter 1 cup half & half

1 cup water 1 tsp basil, salt, and pepper

Directions:

Sauté onion in butter. Add zucchini and water. Simmer 30 minutes. Remove from heat and whirl in blender. Return to pan, add cream of chicken soup, milk, half & half, and seasonings. Reheat.

Yield: About 4 servings

There is always an abundance of zucchini this time of year (sometimes an over-abundance!), so it's perfect timing for this recipe.
