PFLAG to show the movie "1946"

PFLAG will show the award-winning documentary, "1946: The Mistranslation that Shifted Culture," at its regular meeting on Monday, November 11, at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.

The documentary "1946: The Mistranslation That Shifted Culture" explores a significant mistranslation in the Bible that occurred in 1946. This mistranslation involved the term "homosexual," which was incorrectly used in the Revised Standard Version of the Bible. This error has had a profound impact on Christian attitudes towards the LGBT+ community.

The film delves into the discovery of this mistranslation through archives at Yale University and follows researchers who trace the origins of anti-gay sentiment among Christians to this pivotal error. It challenges the biblical justification for LGBT+ discrimination and aims to shed light on

how this mistranslation has influenced cultural and religious views over the decades.

Church Council Update

The Council met on October 1 and on October 16. Both meetings focused on the Charge Conference. We did not conduct any church business at the October 1st meeting. Instead, we reviewed the required reports for the Charge Conference and got them ready to submit. A number of people worked on

these reports - Beth and Patty Evans, Sharon Gallagher, Jean Hefty, Scott Philben, Jim and Kathy Waterman, and Kathy Yelle. The Council read the reports and offered suggestions to improve them.

Thanks to everyone who helped with the Charge Conference. In addition to the folks mentioned above, I want to thank everyone who attended. I hope the turnout of almost all our active members sent DS Wendy the message that we are a vital church and worthy of a good pastor. A special thanks goes to Diane McCalmont for taking minutes at the Conference and to everyone who provided a snack.

Now that the Charge Conference is behind us, our focus is on maintaining the good work that has happened during this time between pastors. As bridge pastor, Patty has done a great job of helping us see the range of work that often falls to the pastor. We believe the church wants a pastor who focuses more on pastoral work than on managing the church. The Council approved hiring a part mite office manager to take on the management tasks. With fees from renting the parsonage, we can pay an office manager. Once a pastor is hired, he/she will live in the parsonage and we will no longer have extra money from rent. If we want both a pastor and an office manager, we will need to increase our giving. You will be hearing a lot about this over the next few weeks. Please give careful thought to what *you* most want from your pastor. For example, if you want the pastor to preach three Sundays per month, the pastor will be less available to take on management tasks.

Always feel free to share your desires, ideas, hopes and concerns with me or another member of the Council.

Recipe Corner

Mom's Apple Crisp

Ingredients:

- \Rightarrow 4 cups sliced apples (Gravensteins or firmer)
- \Rightarrow 1 tsp. cinnamon
- \Rightarrow 1/2 tsp. salt
- \Rightarrow 1/4 cup water
- \Rightarrow 3/4 cup flour
- \Rightarrow 1 cup sugar
- \Rightarrow 1/3 cup soft butter

Directions:

Place the sliced apples in a 10"s6"x2" pan. Mix together the cinnamon, salt, and water, then sprinkle over apples. Mix together flour, sugar, and butter, then sprinkle on top the apple mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.
