I have been a believer all of my life. But there have certainly been times over the years that I have questioned my personal faith as well as faith in general.

As a child I was raised up in the Lutheran faith. When it came time to be confirmed, being a rebellious teen, I felt like I was being blindly led into something that I didn't exactly understand. Yet I was confirmed. I'm sure God was guiding me along that path.

When I moved away from home out of state as a young adult, my Mom offered her wise advice to "Always find a church home. God and a church family would be there for me if I needed help." So yes, as a young mom in Texas, while my husband was deployed to Germany, I sought a family at a Presbyterian church - oh, the comfort I felt.

Then going through divorce, uncertainty of where we were going to land, what I wanted in life, I questioned again. Why was life so hard? Where was the God? Why couldn't I get it together? I didn't exactly stop believing, but I didn't attend a church and practice faith..

Finally deciding to settle where my ex and I had lived (Santa Cruz, CA), I started to feel the need for a regular dose of God. I started attending St. Stephen's Lutheran Church, where I stayed for 27 years. That was my family through many good and tough times. While attending there, my faith was tested yet again when I learned that my 16 year old daughter was pregnant. Whoa! Not something I saw coming or even felt equipped to handle. One evening, after a church meeting I'd attended, I lingered and sat alone in the sanctuary with only the front light on over the stained class portrait of Jesus. I cried and prayed and cried some more. Then I felt it! I literally felt God's presence next to me in that pew. He was calming and still, and I left there knowing that everything would be alright. That was the presence of God that I'd been looking for.

Now at FUMC, I've found another family that has been with me for nearly 20 years! FUMC is the true epitome of Jesus Christ living in this world.

I'm currently using a daily devotion book called *Jesus Calling*, by Sarah Young. It has been a lifesaver for me over this past year. It reminds me daily of the beautiful presence of God in my life, and how to really appreciate that.
