

PASTOR'S 4-WEEK LENTEN STUDY "WHAT MAKES A HERO?" BY MATT RAWLE

What Makes a Hero? offers us an image of what it looks like to be victorious over trials and temptations. Looking at pop culture heroes and others through the lens of faith, Matt Rawle shows how Jesus turned the concept of hero on its head.


In keeping with his theme, "Pop in Culture," the book examines how good vs. evil, right vs. wrong, and overcoming adversity are fundamental to how Christians understand salvation. Heroes help us discern the good, fight for what's right, define identity, execute justice, spark revolution, and save lives. Rawle enters the Gospel story to tell quite a different victory story—one obtained through humility, obedience to the cross, and an empty tomb. How does Jesus redefine what it means to be a hero?

The study includes a DVD featuring Matt Rawle, with the following chapter titles:



Playground Update

Coming Soon! After several years of dreaming and planning, we have finally arrived at Phase 1 of our New Playground Project for our older kids, ages 5 thru 12.

Starting in February, you will see some landscaping changes happening directly across from our existing playground in the area we currently use for a parking lot. It will be transformed into a beautiful new playground area similar to the pre-school playground.

Phase 1 of the plan is to remove the asphalt, fence and bushes, and put a wrought iron fence around the area. The space will be filled with wood chips for now until we acquire our actual playground equipment, which we hope to acquire early in 2018.

At the same time, we will be excavating the sand pit area behind the youth rooms 15 and 16 and installing a 4 person swing set. So watch out for the construction work starting sometime in February and be prepared for a fresh and attractive scenery change at our entrance. Also, during construction, the recycling program will not be available until further notice (see article at right for more details).

RECYCLING PROGRAM

We will be halting the recycling program starting February 1st due to construction work near the area where we store the cans and bottles.

Please do not bring in any recycling items until further notice.

If you recycle appropriate containers at your own homes (using currently available recycling programs offered by the city), please consider continuing to support our missionaries with the funds you collect. You can use one of the self serve recycling centers around town and then donate the proceeds (which have always been used to support our missionaries) back to the church.

Be sure to mark your donation as "Recycling". Thanks for your cooperation.
