#### THE GOLDEN GLEN ACADEMY

(or How to combat the culture...)

The other day, Dan and Doris Gillespie came to visit the pastor, with their six grandkids and their parents in tow. It's not my business what goes on in the pastor's office, but I could hear laughter and much talking, so I knew it must be something nice and I have to admit, I was curious. After the family left, Pastor John shared that the Gillespies had made the appointment so the kids could ask questions and hear John's witness. That further peaked my curiousity and I wanted to hear more about their family values so I telephoned Doris and then Dan, too. The following is what I learned, and it's something I think might inspire other UMCTO families.

Twenty-one years ago, the Gillespie's daughter Robin WIllis gave birth to triplets. Having three infants was overwhelming, and Robin and her husband accepted the offer to move in with Dan and Doris so the grandparents could help with the babies. The Gillespies say those were some of the best times of their lives! When Robin's husband accepted a job in Indiana when the triplets were 8, they were heartbroken to see them go. After thinking it over, Dan suggested they ask to have all their grandkids (their son David had 3 children as well by then) for two weeks every summer, and with the consent of Robin and David & spouses, the grandparents would use that time to pass along values that were important to all the family.



Thus was born the **Golden Glen Academy**, named after the street where the Gillespies have their home.

So, what are these values the Gillepies strive to instill?

They are outlined in the "Golden Glen Academy Oath of Membership" below, and symbolized in their Coat of Arms pictured on the next page:

After church, the kids exclaimed that they loved the class and wanted to come back the following Sunday! The rest is history, but guess who the teacher was? **Barbara Marshall**, of course!

## SSP 2017



The U.S. side of the U.S.-Mexico border. SIERRA SERVICE PROJECT (SSP) - AUGUST 6-12

At least 21 Sr. High youth will be heading to SSP during the first week in August. This year, they travel to San Diego to work in the neighborhood of City Heights. Accommodations will be at **First UMC of San Diego**, Pastor Craig Brown's church (a former UMCTO pastor!) They will also serve with the San Diego Canyonlands on environmental preservation, as well as take a day trip to Tijuana, Mexico during "Adventure Wednesday". As always, they will be building and painting and repairing things for those less fortunate than we all are.

#### About the location:

To the southeast of Mission Valley is the area known as City Heights. This is where SSP will do most of its service work this summer. City Heights is San Diego's most diverse and densely populated area. It is home to about 91,000 people and has a population density 15,000 people per square mile, compared to 4,000 per square mile in the city as a whole. City Heights has a very diverse population. About half of the residents are Hispanic. There are significant populations of people originating from East Africa, South Asia, and the Middle East. About 40 percent of residents were born outside of the U.S. About one-quarter of residents "speak English not well or not at all."

The percentage of people living in poverty in City Heights is about 30 percent. This includes many working people. Most City Heights residents work in service, construction, or industry.




#### SAVE THE DATE - UMW FALL LUNCHEON
