A Word from Your Pastor...

Do you believe in miracles? No, I am not talking about ABC sportscaster Al Michaels' quote heard round the word after the U.S. National Hockey Team beat the heavily favorite Soviet National Team at the 1980 Lake Placid Winter Olympic Games and went on to win the Gold medal. Though it was a miracle that many people still remember to this day. It was called "Miracle on Ice." But what I am thinking of at this moment is the kind of miracles that we not only need to hope and pray for but also prepare for as followers of Christ. And the special season we are about to enter is a perfect time to ask ourselves that question. After all, the Christmas story in itself is all about miracles: the appearance of angels, the star that guided the Three Kings to Bethlehem, and most startling of all the virgin birth, the birth of our Savior. A miracle is simply a special divine action. God is the one who makes miracle possible. But I believe it needs our preparation too. The Story of Christmas and Mary and Joseph all show us how we can prepare our hearts and minds and hands for a miracle. "Do you believe in miracles?" Let's Prepare the Way for Miracles at UMCTO this Christmas as we focus on the Miracle of Bethlehem and Baby Jesus who became miracles for many. It will be our theme during the months of November and December.


About the study:


ADOPT-A-FAMILY FOR CHRISTMAS










CANDLE OF COMMITMENT HONOREES
