## August 25th Administrative Council Meeting Highlights

Financial: June's income was slight and the extra surplus from the Sharing Kitchen has been used up at this point. July Spending is on budget and we are doing well there. Utilities are not too bad considering the use of air conditioning due to the heat. We are looking at about a 4000.00 deficit for the year which is about the same as last year. Things are being paid on time and expenses are consistent with other years for Sunday school, VBS etc.

**Education:** Sunday the 28<sup>th</sup> is Rally Day everything is well planned and we are ready. Things are going well and Hillary Chapman has agreed to do the youth Sunday school class which consists of grades 7-12. Our other teachers remain the same and Pastor Hannah is starting a new bible study starting 8-31-16.

**Trustees:** There are a number of ongoing projects such as the gutters and roof over Education wing which needs looked at, and another coating put on. The estimated life of the main roof is 7-10 years depending on how many more tiles come down. We have estimates on recoating, restoring, and replacing the roof. There are also issues with pigeons in the bell tower. Maintenance has been done on fire extinguishers, boilers, elevator and air conditioners this past month.

*Finance:* We do not have a chair for this committee yet, looking for a willing volunteer.

**Pastors Report:** Charge Conference is upon us and SPRC will be meeting with the DS on September 25<sup>th</sup>. November 12<sup>th</sup> is the date for Charge Conference and it is in Willard this year.

Other Business: The committee discussed the Surveys taken by the congregation and began to look at what areas we want to work on for the coming year. Goals need to be set before Charge Conference.
