In many ways Pentecost is the day that we celebrate the birthday of the church. It is the day that we read from Acts 2 and learn of the early church who had gathered for the Jewish festival of Pentecost. As they gathered the Holy Spirit descended on the people and many began speaking in different languages. This allowed all those gathered to hear about Jesus in their own language. We are told that about 3,000 people came to believe in Jesus on this day. As Christians today we celebrate

TREASURER'S REPORT

Deficit for 2016

While reading a devotional by Rick Warren, I realized I have not reported on the financial situation at St Paul's. St Paul's had a deficit in giving toward the budget of over nine thousand dollars. Because the church had a half time pastor for two years before Pastor Hannah came five years ago, the church had, a cash balance to cover last year's deficit and several years more of deficits.

The church received over \$4,500 in loose offering and \$3,500 from the Sharing Kitchen last year towards a total giving of \$128,000. The remaining \$120,000 divided by approximately 60 givers gives an average of \$2,000 or a tithe of an income of \$20,000. However most of the church income comes from a small group of givers. The medium or middle giver gave \$1,062 in 2016. Half the givers gave less than \$1,062. Starting in July we will have an 85% pastor which will help reduce expenses in the next year. Giving has increased in 2017 and needs to increase even more to eliminate future deficits.

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasurers (money and stuff) on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasurer is, there your heart will be also. Matthew 6:19-21 The devotion of Rick Warren author of The Purpose Driven Life spoke of giving to the church and God's purposes to please God. We can't really give God anything, because he already owns it all. But think about the allowance you got as a child. If you went out and bought a birthday present for your mom, you are really using her money. Does that mean she would like the gift any less? No, because she cares more about the thought and the love behind the gift. God feels the same way about your giving.

Prayer from Rick Warren

Pray this aloud or in your heart today: "Dear God, forgive me for all that I've spent on things that aren't going to last. I want to start investing in Heaven. I want to use my money the way you want me to use it. Today I commit to using my money to grow my character and grow in spiritual strength, wisdom, and knowledge and become all that you want me to be. Help me to see ways that I can use what you have given to me to strengthen relationships and show love to my brothers and sisters in Christ. I want to invest in eternity by using my money to serve others. I want to learn to be generous. I want to be a blessing to others. And I want to use my money to bring people to you. I want people to be in Heaven because I gave. I want to spread the Gospel through my acts of service. And Father, I want to show where my treasure is by investing in eternity through my gifts and offerings to you. I want to honor you by giving you the first part of all my income. I want to give up my lust for money so that the Almighty himself will be my treasure. I pray this in Jesus name. Amen"
