St. Paul's News December 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

2019 is coming to an end...can you believe it. We recently completed our 2019 charge conference (Hallelujah) and I have attached my pastor's report for your review. It has been a wonderful year of ministry and I look forward to where God is leading us in 2020.

Jeremiah 29:11 For surely, I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. 12 Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. 13 When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, 14 I will let you find me, says the LORD, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, says the LORD, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.

Surely God does know the plans that He has for us. If we knew all the things that God was going to call us to do, we would certainly try to convince Him that we had a better plan! However, God's plans for us are always perfect in their wisdom.

We have completed a wonderful year of ministry in our three-church connection. Though members of our congregations were hesitant about this new configuration when it was first presented, it seems as if everyone does agree now that we are stronger and better together.

One of the most exciting things that has occurred in our collaborative ministry is the development of the Better Together Collaborative Ministry Team. There are representatives from each of the three churches and they meet to create a vision for collaborative ministry opportunities for the congregations. This team is a lay led group and have taken the idea of working "better together" to a new level for our connection. To date, they have completed a small group study together, supported taking youth from the churches to the district youth event and they are in the process of planning a mission project for next summer. What a joy it is to see the relationships that are developing within the Better Together team!

Our goals in each of the three congregations have continued to center around developing stronger faith and discipleship within the individual members of our congregations and to begin to think outside of our walls and to engage the community together.

To reach those goals, St. Paul's continues to host the Sharing Kitchen and I have personally become involved by praying with the guests before they eat their meal and also by working on the serving line. We have begun a confirmation class at St. Paul's and have participated in the Wednesday night youth worship at Melmore. Further, St. Paul's has also partnered with Impact Youth Center to allow young people to utilize our church's gym during the winter months. I am also working with the Overflow College Ministry through their one-onone mentoring program and am grateful to be paired with local college student. I have attached a listing of other effects of ministry at St. Paul's.

Republic Trinity has had an exciting year. We have added new members to our congregation. We continue to offer two worship services, one on Sunday morning and one on Sunday evening. We are seeing some cross over attendance from the other congregations at our evening service. (Meaning if someone can't make it to church on Sunday morning, they will come to our evening service on Sunday nights.) We celebrated outdoor worship this year, which was a new experience for some. We are working on creating a stronger and longer-range vision for Trinity and have begun alternating business meetings with vision meetings. Our leadership is looking forward to taking part in a one-day vision development retreat in January of next year.

I continue to be as involved as I can at Melmore UMC. I preach at youth worship on Wednesday nights once a month and also preach at Sunday morning service approximately every two or three months. I continue to participate in their special events. We held are Fall Festival at Melmore UMC last month and welcomed all of the neighborhood kids! It was a beautiful day together.

I continue to strive to live out the call that God has placed on my life. Three churches can be challenging and there are times I don't feel as effective as I want to be. I continue to walk with people through whatever circumstance they find themselves in, because I think that is what God has called me to do and that is what Jesus did and I thank the Holy Spirit for strength and direction.
