





# Subs needed

We are going to have a potluck and live music after worship on September 29th. Bring a dish to share and stay and enjoy food, fellowship and live music.






**From the Finance Committee**: We are excited to introduce a new giving alternative for offerings and tithes. Beginning in September, we will partner with Vanco, an industry leader in donation processing solutions. Through this partnership, we will be able to offer an e-giving alternative for those who attend St. Paul's. There will be the opportunity to give your offering or tithe through a smart phone app or through a giving button on our website. **E-giving is offered as an alternative to the traditional envelope giving system. No one will be required to utilize the E-giving alternative, it is only there for those who wish to utilize it.** 

Most people today use debit and credit cards to make donations or pay for services. And there is an expectation that the organizations they support will offer easy online options. Most churches who utilize E-Giving see an increase in giving.

The Finance Committee has decided to begin a six-month trial of offering an E-Giving option to attendees of St. Paul's. Again, this system will be available for anyone to use, but no one will be required to give through E-Giving. Traditional offering will be taken each Sunday in worship. There will be cards available for those who gave electronically to drop into the offering plate (stating that they gave online).

Fees: There is a \$10 monthly fee that will be charged to the church (though the company will waive the first three months). There is also a small fee for the giver who utilizes E-giving. For giving that is deducted directly from a checking account there is a 1.0% fee, as well as a \$0.45 ACH transaction fee. For example, the fee for a \$100 donation that is deducted from an individual's checking account would be \$1.45. For giving that is processed through a credit or debit card there is a \$2.75% fee, as well as a \$0.45 transaction fee. For example, the fee for \$100 donation that is taken from a credit or debit card would be \$3.20. There is an option for the giver to cover the transaction fee at the time of the gift.

We believe that, because of the changing culture, that it is important to offer an E-Giving option for those who attend St. Paul's. Because we take our role as stewards of the church's finances very seriously, we have decided to enter a trial period, as to ensure that the church does not incur excessive fees or expenses associated with E-Giving.
