

# St. Paul's News *March 2019*



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As I write this letter to you, delegates from all around the world have arrived in St. Louis to complete the work of General Conference 2019. There has been much anticipation leading up to this special General Conference. Our prayers have been and will continue to be that our denomination can successfully navigate a way forward that will allow us to remain the United Methodist Church.

As I prepared myself for the coming General Conference, I was reminded of the story of Jesus calming the storm as read in Mark 4:35-41. <sup>35</sup> That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." <sup>36</sup> Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. <sup>37</sup> A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. <sup>38</sup> Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" <sup>39</sup> He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. <sup>40</sup> He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" <sup>41</sup> They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

The disciple's reaction to the storm and to Jesus as He calms the storm has always intrigued me.

I have often thought that faith must have come easier to them because they walked alongside our Lord as He taught; however, this story reminds us of their tenuous faith and how easily they found themselves afraid of the storm and terrified of the God who could calm it.

I see parallels between us today and our brothers the disciples. Yes, the storms of the world surround us and the winds and waves threaten us, and we call on God to calm the storm because we are afraid. As we call, I hear the words of Jesus ring in my ears. He asks "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

Friends, the words of our God reassure us that we do not need to be afraid. We do not need to be afraid. I intentionally chose to write this letter to you before any decision was made at General Conference. I did that because, though the decisions at General Conference are very important, they are not more important than the words of Christ as He reminds us to be faithful and to rest on His promise that He has overcome the world and its troubles.

As we navigate the days following General Conference and as we accept the challenges and blessings that they bring, I affirm the words that I spoke in worship regarding the ongoing mission of St. Paul's United Methodist Church. We will continue our work to fulfill the Great Commission and we will continue to welcome all those who come in our doors seeking a relationship with Jesus Christ.


## TRUSTEE REPORT



**\$3,444 NEEDED YET FOR FINAL  
PAYMENT ON PIGEON CLEANUP  
PROJECT**

As the Trustee's were waiting for the roof project to start early last Fall, they discovered that a pigeon problem in the bell tower was bigger than they knew. Several experts reviewed the problem and two quotes were received. M J Brown was the lowest and they were here to work on the tower as part of the roofing project. They completed the clean up by the end of January. A donation was received last year to cover most of the not to exceed quote of \$10,500. The Trustees reviewed the clean- up, metal screening, and floor covering on the inside of the tower to avoid future problems and damage. The additional cost of \$3,444 and donations for this work are being requested.
