RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

I wanted to give everyone an update on in-person worship. We began the month of June worshiping outdoors. The third Sunday of June, the weather prevented us from worshiping outdoors. After discussion with the Seneca County Health District, our District Superintendent and after having received input from our worship committee and trustees committee, we made the decision to move indoors for worship. This decision was based on the fact that cases within our county are very limited and also because we have adequate space within our sanctuary for social distancing.

We have asked all who attend in-person worship to follow the guidelines below. I am happy to report that the vast majority of people attending worship have complied with these guidelines. The times that I have noticed someone not complying with the guidelines, I believe, it was due to habit. I am confident that we can continue to safely worship indoors as long as everyone complies with the following.

- Please avoid attending worship if you are feeling ill or have a fever.
- Entry doors will remain propped open for touchless entry.
- Elevator button panel will be wiped down by user with sanitizer wipes between uses.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entrances.
- Collection plates will not be passed; they will be placed on the tables at the back of the sanctuary.
- Social distancing will be required; family groups will sit together (pews will be marked off, with every other pew being available for seating.)
- Air conditioning will be utilized to draw outside air into the sanctuary.
- Masks will be worn while moving throughout the building; masks can be removed only when seated in the pews; congregants can elect to leave masks on for the duration of service if they wish.
- There will be no congregational singing; solos and special musicians will be included in the worship service (with appropriate social distancing).
- Sanitizers will be available in available restrooms so that surfaces can be wiped down after use (including toilet handle, door handles and faucet handles).
- Fellowship coffee hour is suspended until further notice.
- Attendance will be taken to ensure the ability to perform contract tracing should there be a need. The Seneca County Health Department will be notified if there is a congregant who tests positive for COVID-19.
- Alternative (online) methods for worship will continue to be available for those who are at-risk, homebound or unable to attend in-person worship.

I know that seems like a lot of things we CAN'T do. Please continue reading for more information on what we CAN do!

UPDATE ON OFFICE HOURS:

The SPRC has been in ongoing communication with Joyce and with Pastor Charlene regarding office hours.

As of June 22, 2020, Joyce has returned to the church office for her normal working hours (Mon, Tue, Thurs, Fri from 8:30-12:00).

Due to the demands and structure of ministry during the pandemic, Pastor Charlene continues to work remotely for the most part. The home office in the parsonage is better equipped for her frequent online meetings, online classes and worship preparation. Additionally, Pastor Charlene has a recording space set up in the parsonage (for prerecording worship services). She continues to stop by the church frequently throughout the week to gather mail and to check in.

Pastor Charlene has been and continues to be available by telephone, text, or appointment any time during the typical workday. She has met with people in their homes if they need to meet with her or she can meet them at the church (social distance guidelines have and will be followed).

The Key to our Contentment lies in our hearts and minds! Rather than think of the guidelines in a negative way, please try to reframe it to think of them as acts of love for each other (similar to when you ask before touching a newborn baby and sanitize your hands before holding the baby). I understand and honor that we all have differing feelings surrounding these acts of loving kindness. However, I ask that you recognize that someone else in our congregation (someone that you love) may have the opposite feelings and you want to honor their feelings, just as you want to be respected and honored yourself.

Things we CAN do in worship:

- Bring a positive attitude to church each week. This is especially important for the young people in our congregation. They will be watching to see how we handle adversity in the church. Let our actions be worthy of their attention.
- As you sit with your family unit, be sure to smile and wave and greet each other safely from a distance. We have all missed each other so much and it will be wonderful to be in the same space.
- Bring your creativity: We have the opportunity to return to worship in new and creative ways! We can't sing together, but we could raise homemade signs that say AMEN or RAISE A HALLELUJAH. Our worship experience is only limited by our own imaginations!
- Please text me your prayer concerns (567-207-0553) so that they can be shared during prayer time. (You even have permission to text during church if you forget prior to service). We can't share a microphone, but we can still share our joys and concerns!
- We are permitted to share time together in small groups. This might be the time for you to host a small group in your home (or your yard). Let Pastor Charlene know that you would like to host a small group and we can make a plan!
- Participate fully in worship! Do you have a special talent? Play a musical instrument or sing? You are invited to be a part of the worship service and highlight those talents that God gave you.
- We can keep the MAIN thing as the MAIN thing: We often forget that worship is not about us at all. Worship is about honoring God and praising God. If we enter into worship with that attitude, it keeps us focused on praising and honoring God with our worship.

FCFH First Call For Help

"In the past First Call For Help has raised supplies and funds to help make sure that every child was fully prepared for the academic year ahead of them. We asked for monetary donations, held a school supply drive and distributed supplies to the children through a makeshift "store" where the kids had more control over what they received. With current social distancing restrictions, it has become apparent that how the program has been conducted in the past will not be feasible this year. Whether they are attending class, or doing assignments at home, it is our plan to continue to providing school supply assistance to children from low income families in grades K-12 who attend any

Tiffin or rural Seneca County School (Fostoria excluded). Any family that falls at or below 200% the Federal Poverty Level or could prove a significant financial hardship is eligible for assistance.

Last year we provided supplies and more for 342 children during distribution. Though the need and method of delivery may be different, we hope to help even more students. To realize this goal, we are reaching out for support from like-minded individuals who believe as we do, that all children should begin the new school year with the tools and materials they need to succeed.
