# St. Paul's News June 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

In January of this year, our congregation spent time taking a look at our own personal discipleship practices. We talked about using the "Discipleship Five" tools as a way to deepen our discipleship and as a way to periodically check in as to how we are doing in following Christ.

We are approaching the halfway point of 2021. Can you believe it? Half of our year is almost over. This is a great time to check in with yourself and to assess your personal discipleship practices. Are things going well? Are there areas for improvement? It seems that there is always something that can be improved upon.

## THE DISCIPLESHIP FIVE

WORSHIP: Have you been attending worship consistently? During the past year, we have learned how valuable worshipping together is. When you are not in worship, others in our faith community miss you. It can be more challenging to attend church during the summer months because there are so many different activities vying for our attention. Make worship a priority! It is a vital part of your spiritual health and personal discipleship. Are you worshipping with your faith community weekly? Can you commit to praying five times daily (when you wake, each mealtime and before bed)?

GROW: We are called to grow through study our entire lives. How has your study life been going? As the mother of a 2021 high school graduate, I had to reiterate to Dominic that we are all called to be lifelong learners. It's not over when you graduate! Have you been intentional about studying God's word? There are so many options for study now...video based, books, small groups. If you need a recommendation, don't hesitate to ask! Can you commit to reading five verses of scripture each day?

SERVE: Serving others is an act of worship and it impacts us as deeply as it impacts those that we serve. How is your life of service? Acts of service do not have to be

There are opportunities for service all around us! Can you commit to performing five random acts of kindness or service this week?

GIVE: We are created in the image of God and God has been so generous with each of us. Are you striving to live a life of extravagant generosity? Are you being generous with your time, with your talent and with your treasures? Have you fulfilled your vow to the church by supporting its ministries? Can you commit to five acts of generosity this month?

SHARE: Jesus has done a miraculous work in your life! Have you shared your testimony with anyone recently? Often times we become anxious about sharing our faith life with someone. That is when I lean on the words of St. Francis who said, "preach the gospel, use words when necessary." Does your life reflect your faith? Do you live in such a way that you reflect the fruits of God's Spirit? Do you take opportunities as they present themselves to pray with another person? Have you invited someone to church? I shared, in January, that we are often likely to share our experience at a local restaurant, but we hesitate to share our experience with God. Which is more important? Can you commit to sharing your faith with someone this month? Can you commit to inviting another family or a friend to church?

# **GRADUATE SPOTLIGHT**


Dominic Consolo, son of Pastor Charlene (David) Thomas and Christopher Consolo, is a 2021 graduate of North Central Academy in Tiffin.


