Greetings from St. Paul's Missions Committee:

The Missions Committee met on September 12. We reviewed and voted on the distribution of the Leeann Wolff funds for the 2nd half of 2021. We will be distributing \$110 to each of the following: Flat Rock, Sharing Kitchen, SOULS, YMCA food program, Connections, Youth Club, and First Call for Help-Teens Christmas.

Our mission projects for the remainder of this year were also discussed. We will be changing from supporting FISH to supporting a project for Sharing Kitchen for the September-October mission. FISH informed us that they have developed a very good and reliable supply chain and, in their abundance, have been bringing items to the Sharing Kitchen. A list of items still needed will be included at the end of this article. This list will include items desired for their Christmas party.

In October-November we will again be participating in Operation Christmas Child (The Shoebox Ministry). Our Youth Fellowship has again agreed to put together the cardboard shoeboxes and place them on the landing in front of the sanctuary. These will be available in late October/early November so that they can be turned in by November 15-22. Further directions and a display will be set up closer to this mission time.

In December we will again be participating in the Angel Tree mission. A need has been identified for not only the children's clothing that we have collected in the past but will also include much needed clothing for teens up to size 3x. The limit per item is \$20 and the items should be unwrapped. More information and a tree with angels will appear closer to this mission time.

It is always of interest to know what good works we helped support in our Missions projects. We sent money to Church World Service blankets and kits program. In 2020 they provided 16,965 blankets, 27,760 hygiene kits, 6,222 cleanup bucket kits, and 13,020 school kits in the United States.

Internationally they provided blankets and cleanup buckets to the Bahamas, blankets to Mexico, school and hygiene kits to Cuba, hygiene kits to Haiti, blankets, and hygiene kits to Puerto Rico, and 15,000 school kits to Romania. WOW! The Third Sunday Offering for September was \$71.00. This donation goes to First Call for Help in Tiffin.

As always, thank you Church for your support of our missions.

Two by Two Covering More Ground

Last winter when things were still a little closed up due to COVID, Pastor Charlene and I were blessed by a new ministry called "Joyful Contagion." The idea was hatched late one night when we were texting back and forth about something else with some church members. What we planned to do was to drop off goodie bags to all of our church members once a month—little reminders of joy in a season that hadn't been as joyful as we liked.

Bagging the items was the easy part—the harder part was finding everyone's homes and getting the items dropped off. Delivery times stretched out over entire afternoons—even with help. Who knew that it could take so long to drop things off? And then, one of our members realized that life could be easier if we combined forces. Some of Melmore's members lived in Tiffin: some of Trinity's members lived south of Bloomville; some of St. Paul's members lived south of town right around where some Melmore members lived. There was overlap all over the place. So, we mapped it, broke it up into geographical sections rather than by church, and cut our delivery time down significantly. We were able to cover more ground in less time when we worked out a system together.

And our ministry is like that in other ways too. We help each other cover visitation; we find ways to share resources between churches; we look for people at one church who might love to join in mission with folks at another, because when we look at ways that we can streamline what we are doing and share in the kingdom work, we can cover more ground in the process. This has allowed us to have larger confirmation classes where the kids can interact with each other; has given us the opportunity to share food resources with more people in need; and has helped us to raise larger amounts of money to be used in mission, not just in our local area, but around the world. We can cover more ground when we work together.


Friday Fun-Days-Melmore UMC


A freewill offering will be taken to cover expenses.
