Throughout Lent we have been following the story of our scripture from the beginning to the story of Jesus. Together through Sunday worship and daily reading of scripture we are discovering our profound need for a Savior and the saving work of Jesus Christ. We will continue to explore this story together as we approach Easter Sunday through both our regular Sunday worship times and several special gatherings.

Holy week begins on April 13th as we will celebrate Palm Sunday by hearing the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the children will pass out palms in our worship service. Throughout the week services and special events are as follows:
