From the Pastor's Pen:

St. Paul's,

Happy Easter! At the beginning of April we celebrate the resurrection of Christ and the beginning of the Easter season in our church. The season of Easter actually lasts for 50 days, beginning at Easter and continuing until Pentecost on May 24th. During this time we as the church both celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and seek to live out our lives as people of the resurrection.

During Easter season this year, we will be focusing on the book of 1 John during worship. This short letter near the end of the New Testament teaches us how to live as people who worship the God of eternal life in our everyday lives. We will discuss forgiveness, light, prayer, truth, and love.

As we start this time in 1 John allow me to share some of my favorite verses in this epistle. They are found in 1 John 4:7-12: "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God: everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us."

During the Easter season we praise God who loved us so much that he sent his son into the world to die and conquer death so that we might have a restored relationship with him for eternity. As loved and forgiven people when then seek out ways to love others as God has loved us. Join us this Easter season as we strive to be people who love God and love others in all that we do.

The trustees have many things to keep them busy:

- Snow removal—the parking lot is contracted out; however, the sidewalks are done by members of the Trustee Committee mainly Rich Kinstler and Gary Arnold. Early morning or late evening they were busy with their shovels.
- Members come in early to check the boilers and turn on heat where needed for that day's activities. Recently the boiler needed repair, and it was fixed so church members would be warm.
- Bathrooms are constantly in need of some repair. Toilets have been replaced in the bathroom off the Helen Bean room and the bathroom near the choir room. We now will be working to repair & pain the areas around the new toilets.
- Gym—moisture has caused problems with the floor tile. There have been many tiles replaced. Now lights were installed in the gym.

Misc. items—Grease trap cleaned, light bulbs replaced, window air conditioners put in for the summer & then removed in the fall. A new copier was purchased for the secretary's office. Central air was installed for the sanctuary—a gift from the Vincent & Eleanor Arnold Fund. New drapes in the secretary's office. The Edison chandelier was repaired and all lights are lit. The list is

endless! We have dedicated people on the Trustee Committee!

Cleaning of the church: We do not have a janitor so we are depending on volunteers. It is a **BIG** job to keep the church clean. We could use some help. As of now Rich is doing the BIG JOB of sweeping—3 floors and Marilou is dusting many areas, cleaning the nursery and bathrooms.
