Prayer Focus

As I re-read last month's concerns I realize I could be writing most of that today! Our world remains so troubled. The natural world continues to

plague us. Here we witnessed the devastation high winds and low-grade tornadoes can produce. Let us give thanks that no one was killed, comfort those who lost much, suffered from power outages and water damage. As I write we are in the midst of a devastating heat wave across much of the nation's mid-section. Those elderly, particularly those who live in cities with vast spaces of concrete, without airconditioning need special prayers. Check on any neighbors regularly. This will be true throughout the summer. The cycle continues as new wildfires are burning in the west.

The world remains plagued with wars. The Syrian conflict goes on with some of the rebel forces now attacking each other. The plight of the refugees increases with 2 million displaced internally and 1 million in other countries. The UN warns this could become a catastrophe and the large number of refugees (in Lebanon, Egypt, Jordan, Iraq and Turkey) could destabilize the area. The UN has asked for much more aid world-wide than has been provided. Both Iraq and Egypt are teetering on the brink of civil wars. I can't begin to sort out who are the good guys and who the bad but I know the entire region needs our prayers.

The recent UN testimony of Malala Yousafzai , the young woman shot in Pakistan for advocating education of girls, reminds us again of the many types and kinds of abuse of women world-wide. Many recent rulings in several states including Ohio health difficulties for women. Here in the US sexual concerns continue. We have prayed about the frequency of rape in the military and those prayers remain needed. The rest of us live in a sexual, violent culture. Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine says we have an obligation to do more to educate young people about rape, an unacceptable horrible crime of violence. We need prayers of insight for those who are creating violent societal messages on television and movies.

Prayers of praise for those who made Vacation Bible School another success. A creative program takes much work by so many. So thank you all. And pray too for the children who attended; may the lessons learned be for a lifetime.



TRUSTEES PROPOSE A PAINTING CONTRACTOR

At the July 17 meeting of the Trustees, Gary Arnold reviewed all the quotes and qualifications of those desiring to paint the white outside on two sides of the church. The board voted to send to the administrative council the quote from Breindenbach's Painting for \$17,500. The Trustees have almost \$10,000 in their maintenance fund. Donations are still being collected. The administrative council will need to redesignate other funds to make up the difference. The front and the Patchworks sides of the church are to be painted this year.

Other subjects reviewed at the meeting were the new heat pump at the parsonage, landscaping at the parsonage, the timing on a second quote for the sound system, storm water on the gym floor three times, and a new sweeper for the cleaning angels.
