SHARING KITCHEN CHRISTMAS PARTY DECEMBER 14, 2013 In October the Sharing Kitchen served 539 adults and 28 kids using 149 helpers. Donations were very great in October, but are slowing down in November. We got our first turkey of the holiday season. This year was unusual because most of our turkeys from Kroger came after Easter. Remember new and good used items for the Christmas party. We hope to have 150+ adults and 91+ kids again this year.





The Christmas Program will be presented on Sun., Dec. 8, 2013, at 10 A.M., during the worship service. There will be special music in addition to a presentation of the Nativity.

Dress rehearsal for the Children's Christmas Program is Sun., Dec. 1, after Sun. school. A light lunch will be provided from 12-12:30. Rehearsal will be from 12:30-1:30 P.M. Parents/grandparents are especially encouraged to accompany preschool children to the lunch and rehearsal. Children will practice bells and the combined choir number during Children's Church and immediately after church in the choir loft on Dec. 1. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE OCTOBER 24TH ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING

Financial: September receipts were good. Expenses were \$10,828.88 and receipts were \$11,816.77. Apportionments are paid to date. Gaylen Kline will become a substitute money counter. No one should enter the church office on Sunday mornings while the volunteers are counting money. A new safe was donated for use in the office. The 2014 budget of \$123,500 was approved. Savings are to be realized next year because of our participation in Programs offering lower rates on natural gas and insurance available through the Conference.

Education: Signs are needed in classrooms to indicate the location of severe weather assembly areas which are located in the youth room, areas off the gym and the closet off the fellowship hall. Youth Club is under way and going well. The children's Christmas program is planned for December 8th with rehearsal on December 1st. The ice cream left from serving apple dumpling is to be given to the youth lock-in, Youth Club or Sharing Kitchen. A new copier for church use is in the small room off the Helen Bean room. Kendullin Fortney and Sandy Ritter are new substitute Sunday school teachers.

Missions: The Christmas Child Shoebox ministry is underway with boxes to be returned by November 10th. United Methodist Student Day is November 24th. Donations of \$105 were received for the October 20th third Sunday ingathering for community needs.

Trustees: Sound system upgrades are ordered and will be installed soon. Rich Kinstler has been painting window frames on the sides and rear of the church. He has painted 62 to date with more to be done. Eaves and window painting work needs to be done at PatchWorks House. The trustees are looking into security cameras for both inside and outside the church. Our insurance will be secured through the Conference at a saving of \$800 a year.

Pastor Hannah: An anonymous donor has made it possible for St. Paul's to receive tee shirts for STAND at Columbian high school. Charge conference is to be at St. Paul's on November 21st with Faith UMC joining us. Inactive members have received a second letter. A third letter will be sent in 2014. Those who do not respond to it will be removed from the membership rolls.



In November, the youth had a great time at our costume party. We also had a great turn out for our annual Lock-in. There were 19 middle school and high school youth that spent the night at the church.
