such a strong showing from St. Paul's at the ordination service. I thank all of you who were able to make it to the service, as well as those we were there in spirit and have since sent many cards and given me many words of congratulations.

Brothers and sisters, Jesus is calling us up too. I encourage you to take the next step in your faith journey this summer. Use this time to commit yourself to Christ, start a spiritual practice, serve in a new way, or go deeper in your faith.
