St. Paul's,

Last week was our Annual Conference, the yearly gathering that our United Methodist conference, East Ohio, holds to report, celebrate, and look ahead to the future. The theme this year was "Jesus is Calling," and our worship time together focused on what and how Jesus is calling us individual and as part of the church. Throughout the committee report and resolutions, this theme of "Jesus is Calling" was continually emphasized.

Overall, it seems as though our conference is moving in a positive direction. We continue to be financially stable thanks mainly to the high number of churches paying their full amount of apportionments, something that we here at St. Paul's continue to do. While membership of churches does continue to decline. I am proud to report that St. Paul's is in the roughly 1/3 of churches in the conferences whose average worship attendance either increased or remained the same in the past year. Our conference also continues to remain strong in our support of missions both locally and around the world. The 3 C's program, something that is unique to our East Ohio Conference, continues to remain strong with much work including monetary donations and short term mission trips being done to help develop churches, clinics, and classrooms in Liberia, Sierra Leone, Russia, and Zimbabwe. our health kits that we brought to Lakeside joined a semi-truck load of other relief kits to go to the Midwest Distribution center to be used as emergency relief.

While there were no major changes voted on during Annual Conference that will directly impact St. Paul's, I encourage us to continue to keep all churches in our conference in prayer as many of them will face pastoral transitions and other new circumstances in the upcoming weeks. Also continue to pray for the great work that our churches are able to do together in the mission field around our world.

### **Prayer Focus**

How similar are the concerns from month to month! We always remember those coping with natural disasters that need our prayers. Keep

the hurricane and tornado victims in prayer even as we focus on the victims of wildfires in California and Colorado. I know of one family who, like many, had only 15 minutes to gather such belongings as they could and to evacuate before their home was engulfed. Prayers of thanksgiving for the first responders who help in these emergencies. Floods displaced many in Calgary. In India, flash floods left 1000 dead, 40,000 stranded and thousands missing. Pray for help and comfort for all of those.

Violence in Mid-East continues unabated. Certainly prayers are needed for Syria where in a country just over 20 million people; the death toll has surged past 70,000. More than 1.4 million have fled the country and 4.25 million are internally displaced and 6.8 million are in need of food, water and medical care. As other nations get involved all of this can only increase. Pray too for Iraq which seems to be teetering on the verge of civil war. Over 2000 persons have been killed in domestic violence since April.

Around the world the number of children dying before age 5 has decreased but one group remains at high risk: newborns born to poor families. Save the Children found that babies born to parents in poorest fifth of the population died 40 percent more often than those in the richest fifth. Rich countries also have problems. The US has the highest rate of income inequality in the Western world and the largest number of children who die on the day of their birth. More than 11,000 babies die on the same day they are born, 50% more than in all other industrialized nations combined. Let us pray not only for these children but that governments and medical practitioners can reduce these staggering numbers.

Prayers of Praise for the successful Alive event where many of our children and adults found renewal. Praise for those adults who give of their time and compassion to make this happen. Praise to for those who are helping with One Room Sunday School this summer. The Bible School program during this month also needs our prayers. Prayers of thanksgiving for the Sharing Kitchen's successful Christmas in June and those who made it possible. And for all the volunteers who have made the Kitchen program possible for over 25 years.

As Tiny Tim said, God bless us everyone.
