

From the Pastor's Pen:

St. Paul's.

It has been a busy month of May as we celebrated graduates, welcomed confirmands into membership in our church, and remembered those in our congregation who passed away in the past year. Just as it has been a busy month in the life of our local denomination, it has also been a busy time in our larger United Methodist denomination. From May 10-20 our United Methodist held its General Conference, an event held every four years featuring delegates from around the world who are tasked with making official decisions for our church and celebrating the good that we have done throughout the world.

This year as United Methodist we were able to celebrate 60 years of ordination for women, the 25th anniversary of Africa University, and the upcoming 150th anniversary of United Methodist Women. We also praised God for the success of our Imagine No Malaria ministry. Since we started Imagine No Malaria in 2008, the death rate of malaria in Africa has been cut in half. However, we still have work to do, so the UMC is announcing the beginning of the Abundant Health Initiative. Six million children die each year of preventable diseases like malaria, our new goal as a church is to reach one million children with life saving prevention measures by 2020. As

Abundant Health gets going pay attention for ways St. Paul's will be involved. In the midst of celebration our sisters and brothers in the faith also debated and sought God's will on many issues facing our church. We approved additional bishops and funding for the church in Africa, which continues to grow and reach new people. We passed a new budget with a slight increase from the last four years.

We continue to be a church deeply divided on issues surrounding human sexuality. Following leadership that was requested by our bishops, the conference voted to form a special commission to study and make decisions regarding how our church will face these issues. We will want to keep all those making these difficult decisions in prayer for the next several years. Even in the midst of these difficult decisions I believe that we continue to be a denomination and a local church that seeks to live out our mission statement to "Make Disciples of Christ for the Transformation of the World."


