Prayer Focus

The poet reminds us, "What is so rare as a day in June?" For many days, and many of us, that's a truism. But not for all of God's children. As usual the

need for prayer exceeds our comprehension. This is tornado season and already the damage from winds, hail, heavy rain and flooding has been great with loss of both lives and property. The damage in More OK is beyond belief. So many yet to be accounted for! Like so many natural disasters, the effects of these will be felt for months and years. People are just beginning to recover from last year's Hurricane Sandy so those new victims have a long path ahead of them. . Elsewhere in the world earthquakes are another form of natural disaster. A May 7.0 quake in Sichaun province China killed 200 and left about 100,000 homeless. Let's keep those affected by wind, fire and flood in our prayers always

As for the rest of the world, man's inhumanity to man continues. It's amazing how unloving we can be. In two days, I compiled the following list of this type of event from the New York Times: Attacks on militants in Nigeria, Violence in Afghanistan including 6 dead in one attack in Kandahar, fighting, refugees, hunger and lack of water in Syria, In Pakistan an official killed and 13 killed in bombings in Mosques, North Korean missile tests, Torture of detainees in Syria, Dozens killed in Iraqi bombings, Toxic oil wastes piling up in Canada about to be shipped to the US, Increasing military suicides, Increasing sexual misconduct in military. And that's just a two day list! The horrible deaths of over 1100 in the Bangladesh factory weren't even mentioned! I'm sure there are more but this should keep us praying for the month as these are on-going problems for us humans.

This is also the time of year to send prayers of praise for the school teachers and Sunday School teachers who have worked all year with our children. Prayers for the children as they enjoy the summer vacations are also in order. We are grateful also for our members who are graduating from high school and college and ask for God's blessings as they start new phases of their lives.

June is Annual Conference month and we should ask for insights and blessing as that assembly of United Methodists assemble to plan for the coming year.

May your June be filled with roses, which to me symbolize God's unending Grace



Administrative Council Highlights for the April 25, 2013 Meeting

Financial: Receipts were good for March. Utility costs have increased. Giving for non-budgeted items was higher last year. Darrin McGinnis and Amy Vittorio will be additional financial secretaries.

Lay Leadership: Paul Fortney was elected as a member of the board of trustees to replace Bud Eley. The committee will meet to nominate officers for the coming year. Someone is needed to attend Annual Conference from June 17th to 20th.

Education and Youth: Over \$300 was donated during the spaghetti dinner to go toward Alive! The Easter egg hunt was successful. The education committee will provide the coffee hour on May 19th for graduates and June 2nd for the confirmation class. VBS is scheduled for July 14th to 18th from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m.

Missions: Thirty-three jars of peanut butter were donated for Haiti. Food was given for FISH during Lent. \$408 was raised for Alive at the January soup and sandwich luncheon. The Easter offering for the Sharing Kitchen was over \$215.

Trustees: Bids are being taken for painting the outside trim of the church. Volunteers are encouraged to help with the painting to save money. Improvements will be made to the sound system. The parsonage heat pump and water heater are being studied.

Worship: Four special Sundays will be May 12^{th} – Youth Sunday, May 19^{th} – graduates, May 26^{th} – Memorial Sunday, June 2^{nd} – confirmation class.

Staff/Parish: Job descriptions for the staff are being updated. A luncheon will be held in August to honor the church's volunteers.

Sharing Kitchen: Attendance was up in April. Many food donations continue to come in.

Pastor: It was agreed that we will prepare for a new photo directory this fall.

Administrative Council Highlights for the May 23, 2013 Meeting

Financial: Expenses and receipts are on budget as of the end of April. Utility costs were higher this year because of colder weather. Apportionments are paid to date.

Lay Leadership: The committee is contacting past and potential officers by telephone this year. The slate should be ready soon. A delegate to Annual Conference June 17 - 20, 2013 is still needed.

Education: VBS plans are underway. College graduates were honored on May 19. The confirmation class is to be received and honored on June 2nd. Children's Sunday School will be held during the worship hour throughout the summer. Karen Kinstler has been giving piano lessons to several young people.

Missions: The youth are coordinating the health kit project again this year. Kits are to be brought to the church by the beginning of June and will be taken to Annual Conference. A fund raising lunch is to be held on July 14th. The Easter offering of \$270 was designated for the Sharing Kitchen.

Trustees: A new heat pump will be purchased for the parsonage. Quotes are being gathered for upgrades to the sound system. The Sharing Kitchen provided funds to help with the maintenance fund. Bids are being accepted for painting the trim on the church. This is a major expense and will only be for the front exterior of the church for now. The Sharing Kitchen will provide funds and volunteers to shingle the roof of the frame garage. Tiffin Scenic Studios is making and donating curtains for the two church offices. Those members who have been cleaning the church and planting flowers were thanked.

Pastor Hannah is looking into a program in which we were invited to participate. It is called "Helping Congregations Live up to Their Potential".

A new pictorial directory is scheduled to be made in the fall. Members will be contacted by the Universal company out of Mansfield to set up appointments. Dates for the picture taking are September 23 and 24.

The 2013 goals were reviewed and groups are encouraged to carry them out.



Nathan Armstrong presented a letter telling of his experiences at Taylor University and inviting St. Paul's to make donations which the university will match. Members' individual gifts marked with Nathan's name in the memo line can be made out to the church and will be sent by the treasurer to the university.

1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-sized brushes)


