Hello everyone,

As it was announced on Sunday, we will be halting all in person worship and gatherings until further notice. We do not know when we will be reinstated for any in person gatherings, but the administrative council and I will monitor the situation to determine what is safest for our community moving forward. It is important to note that I will primarily work from home during this halt of in person gatherings while only being in the office sporadically to drop off mail, scan documents, etc. The best way to contact me is by phone 276-451-8509 or by email at pastorkevin89@gmail.com. Through the remainder of this letter, I will explain the ways we can stay connected with one another virtually. Whether you have Facebook or don't, whether you are internet savy or not, or whether you prefer mail, we have options for people to remain connected.

Sermon by Phone

I recently subscribed to a service called Sermon-by-Phone. Sermon-byphone works by you calling this phone number, 1-406-203-4495, each week as described below. This service will include a few weekly updates like, the audio version of Jake's Wednesday concerts, Pastor Kevin's weekly reflections, and our weekly service. You will have to call at a specific day to hear each of these events because I can only upload one file at a time. In other words, once I upload my reflection on Fridays, Jake's concerts will no longer be available to listen to via phone. Below is when each event will be available and at what time.

Facebook Live and Zoom

Our Facebook Livestream is how most of you have connected when you have not joined us for in-person worship. Facebook Live will remain on the same schedule at our 11:00 a.m. gathering time. We may pursue using an-



other option as well to make the services a little more interactive. On December 13th, 2020, I am going to try and have some people be readers for scripture and offer prayers during our service using Zoom. We would still watch the service on Facebook as we normally do but Zoom has an option to connect to our livestream services to have more people gather in a meeting. If you would like to be a reader or read a prayer during the service via zoom, then contact Joan Haugerberg or Pastor Kevin by Wednesday, December 9th.

Using the Website & Christmas Eve

Our website will have weekly updates as well. Greg has uploaded last week's concert and pastoral reflection from Facebook to the website. We will continue to due this along with posting a copy of my sermon, which will include an order of the service for those who would like to follow along during the live service at 11:00 a.m. on Facebook. If you can get to our website, at http://glendiveunitedmethodistchurch.com/ then you can find all our weekly videos, sermons, and updates as well from one quick and easy to find location.

Until further notice, our Christmas Eve service will be online via Facebook Live on December 24th, 7 p.m. If the administrative council and I decide we can return to our in-person gatherings before Christmas Eve, then we will notify everyone and the community. However, I am planning to hold the service online at this point due to the spread of Covid-19 in our community.

We will still hold our weekly livestreams as we have in the past with Jake's concerts on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 p.m., Pastor Kevin's weekly reflection Thursday afternoons at 3:00 p.m., and our worship service Sundays mornings at 11:00 a.m. We will certainly be celebrating Advent and Christmas differently than years past, but I am thankful we live in a day and age where staying connected provides us with multiple options of meeting virtually! Advent isn't cancelled but merely celebrated in a new way and with a new presence! The Light of the World and the Prince of Peace will still be born on Christmas day as we celebrate Love being born into the world! May we continue to prepare our hearts and minds for this wonderful season of Peace, Hope, Love, and Joy.
