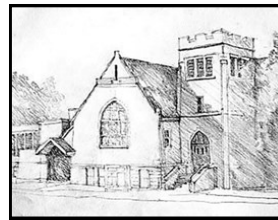


# Glendive & Wibaux United Methodist Church Newsletter January 2026



## Pastor letter



This past November, I experienced one of the loneliest seasons of my life—the passing of my father. There were days when grief felt heavy and overwhelming, and I wasn't sure how I would make it through. But in the midst of that pain, God showed up in ways I will never forget. He showed up through the people in my church, who surrounded me with love, prayers, encouragement, and care. Their support lifted me when I couldn't lift myself, and it reminded me that even in the darkest moments, God is present. It was in that time of sorrow that I truly felt God's nearness. There were quiet moments of prayer where His peace came over me, and simple acts of love—from a hug, a meal, a call, or a kind word—that reminded me I was not alone. God used my church family to show me His love in tangible ways, and I am forever grateful for the way they carried me through.

This experience reminded me of something I've always known: we are called to love one another, not just in words, but in action. And here in Glendive and Wibaux, that love is alive every day. When someone struggles, we reach out. When someone celebrates, we celebrate with them. Our towns are filled with people who care for each other, who lift each other up, and who reflect God's love in everything they do. God doesn't only live in churches or in the pages of scripture. He lives in our homes, in our workplaces, and in the ways we treat each other. Every shared smile, every helping hand, every prayer lifted for a friend or neighbor—these are ways God moves in and through us. These acts of love ripple through our community and remind us that no one has to face life alone.

In Glendive and Wibaux, I've witnessed a spirit of support that is rare. People look out for one another here. They encourage one another, celebrate victories, and provide comfort in times of sorrow. This is the heart of God's love in action. It's what makes our towns more than just places to live—they are communities filled with life, faith, and care for each other.

Let us continue to nurture this spirit. Let us reach out, lift each other up, and show God's presence in everything we do. Together, we can make Glendive and Wibaux shining examples of a community living in love, hope, and faith.

May God bless each of you and our towns richly. Let's keep loving one another, supporting one another, and walking in His light every day.

## Making a financial pledge to the Glendive United Methodist Church

**Happy New Year!** It's a new year; a new church budget; so it's also time for a pledge letter. To avoid the expense of an additional mailing, we are sending this church pledge request in the newsletter.

2025 saw some exciting new things for our church – new ceilings and lights in the Fireside Room, the offices, and the nursery; new carpet in the nursery; and a new pastor in July! And we did all that (plus paying our monthly expenses) thanks to:

- Successful fundraisers like our spring rummage sale and the fall Harvest Auction
- The generous giving of our members and friends
- Payment from the Wibaux church

**When we joined the church, we made a promise to support the church with our presence, our prayers, our gifts, and our service.** Our church needs our support, both spiritual and financial, in order to flourish. We donate to our church – for our building which houses our worship and activities and for salaries for our pastor, lay speakers, secretary, musician and custodian who make things happen and run smoothly. *But our church costs don't stop there.* Just like the other budgets in our lives, we have additional costs for things like utilities, maintenance, insurance, and supplies. Wibaux has notified us that they will very likely not be able to give us financial support in 2026 and we expect to see increases in the cost of things like insurance and utilities.

A pledge slip for 2026 giving is below. Although there is no requirement to fill out and return the pledge slip, it is helpful to the Finance Committee to have an idea of pledged income to expect. Even if you don't return the pledge slip, we ask that you make a conscious plan for giving for the year.

Remember that you can always make *designated gifts* toward specific things such as the Air Conditioning Fund or other specified projects. With such *designated giving*, 100% of the donation stays at the local church. Undesignated giving (to the General Fund) has a portion of the donation go to the Conference. Be sure to mark your giving if you wish it to be designated.

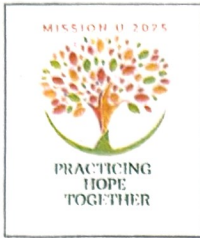
### United Woman in Faith
